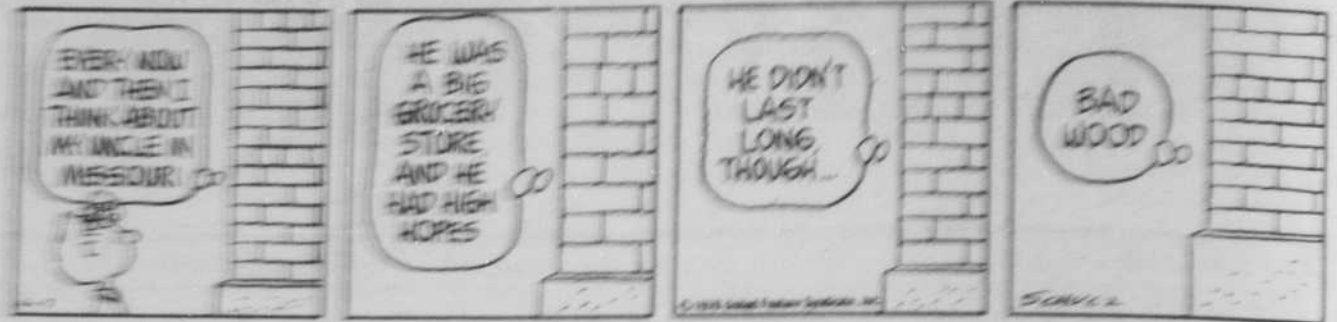
Jeanine Cansler will perform on organ and harpsichord at her Master's degree recital Sunday at 8 p.m.

Litho artist to show work

A show of prints by Jacob Kainen, former curator of prints and drawings for the Smithsonian Institute, highlights the spring exhibitions at the University Museum of Art opening Sunday through May 7.

Kainen, an artist of national reputation who has exhibited widely since his retirement from the Smithsonian in 1970, works in lithography, intaglio, woodcut and silkscreen. About half the 65 works in the retrospective show were done before 1970. The rest have been produced since then.

The public is invited to an opening reception from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday. Refreshments will be served.
