City council listens to T-2000 testimony

Nine persons gave the Eugene City Council some advice on what the area's T-2000 (transportation) plan should include and exclude in a public hearing held Monday night in Eugene.

The council heard testimony to gain citizen support before discussing the \$161 million plan that would develop alternative transportation modes throughout the Eugene-Springfield area. It includes a goal of 30 percent alternative transportation methods, and plans for pedestrian paths, street and highway improvements.

Keith Martin, assistant city manager, urged the council to move rapidly in adopting the final plan so the target date of July 1 could be met.

He said July 1 is the federal cut-off date for federal financing of the Lane Transit District. If T-2000 is not implemented at that time the bus line is likely to lose some of its federal funds.

Much of the testimony was provided by neighborhood group representatives concerned with major road revisions that would bring increased traffic into their areas.

One of the most questioned road plans was the proposed Washington-Jefferson Street Highway ramp that would make it necessary to demolish the Community Center for the Performing Arts located in the west downtown area.

Jim Williams, a citizen from West Eugene, called the hall a "famous historic landmark."

"It's viable to the downtown area and the art organizations," Williams said. "If the hall is torn down, performing art associations will have little or no chance of getting endowment funds."

Richard Hansen urged the council to evaluate the city planner's proposals carefully before adopting the changes.

"You as the council must determine whether the 15 percent alternative transit plan is foolhardy or a realistic goal," Hansen said. "There is no indication the city is moving in that direction."

The council will meet again to discuss the testimony along with other recommendations at noon Wednesday at King's Table in Oakway mall.
