

Oceanographer to speak

Like to dip into a hot springs pool in a garden of exotic fauna? Even if it's 9,000 feet below the surface of the ocean?

John Corliss did just that and he will tell about his experiences in a technical seminar on hydrothermal activity in the ocean at 3:30 today in Room 107, Lawrence Hall. He also will present a free public lecture and film at 7:30 p.m. in Room 150, Geology.

Corliss, an oceanographer from Oregon State University (OSU), was a pioneer at sea for 60 days in February and March of 1977. He and five oceanographers from all over the United States and two OSU students were the first to examine hot springs on the floor of the ocean. They discovered communities of exotic life around all these vents. Corliss describes the areas as being "like lush oases in a sunless desert."

"Some of the animals that we found had never been identified. What we found may also have implications for the origin of primitive life."

Corliss is coordinating another voyage to explore ocean hot springs in February 1979.
