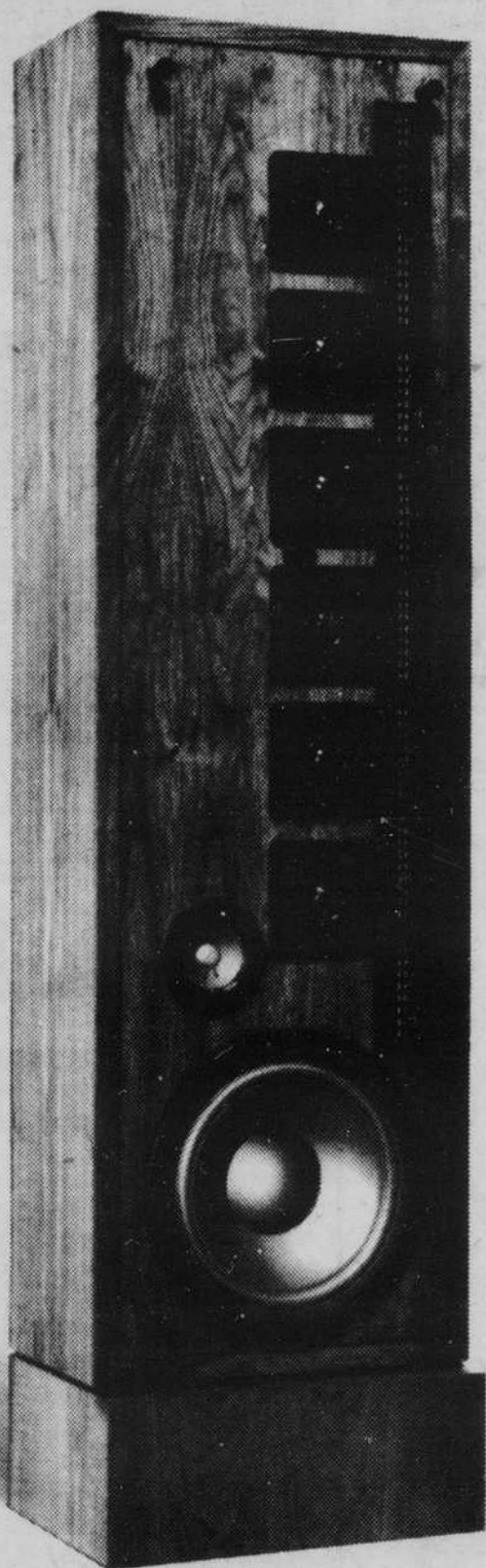
and Phil's job is endangering the two's marriage.

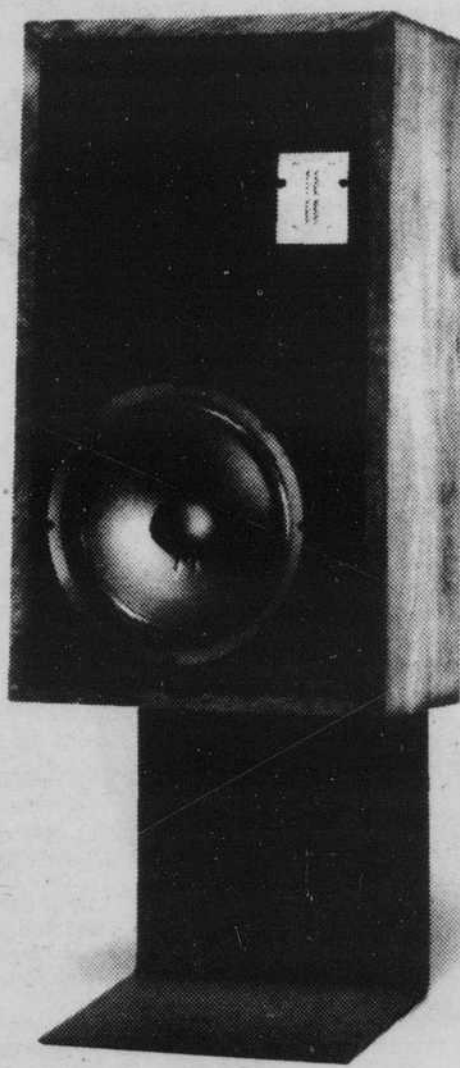
Like my roommate said after seeing a movie where all the nude shots were from the rear, turnabout is fair play. David Thornton, may he rest in peace, might disagree.
