A new state Energy Facility Siting Council rule which could force closure of the Trojan Nuclear Plant by 1982 will be up for public scrutiny at a council meeting in Eugene Tuesday.

The administrative rule would limit nuclear waste storage on the Trojan Plant site until the federal government has a more concrete national nuclear

waste storage plan.

The on-site storage would be limited to one and one-third reactor cores of spent fuel waste, if the rule is adopted.

Trojan's recent refueling left the plant with one-third of a core in storage. Because the nuclear fuel must be replaced annually by thirds, the limits set by the proposed rule would be met by 1982 and the plant forced to close, according to Portland General Electric Co. officials.

The council decided earlier this year to oppose PGE's request for storage expansion to a three and one-third core equivalency; the request now before the federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

The meeting to hear local public input will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in the Federal Bldg. in Eugene, Room 227. The council will remain to hear testimony through the evening, if necessary.

industry continue to meet for private negotiations, in an effort to come to a compromise on 1978 summer field-burning.

City attorney Stan Long and Oregon Seed Council Executive Director Dave Nelson have not made results of their meetings public, though Long has said the opposing sides believe agreement is possible.

Any compromise between the adversaries will have to be approved first by the state Environmental Quality Commission and then by federal Environmental Protection Agency, before implementation.

The EPA has already rejected a state-submitted burning plan which would allow growers a 180,000-acre limit.
