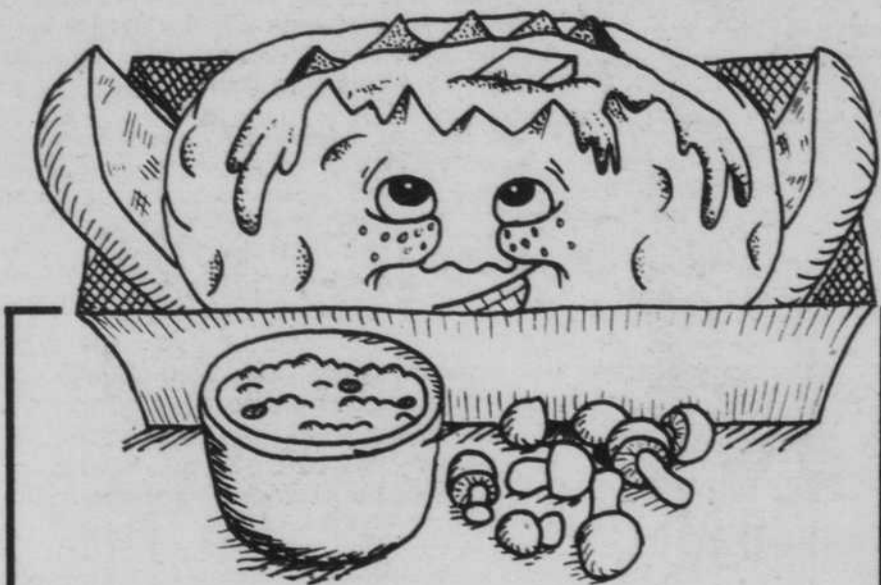


Music grads slate spooof

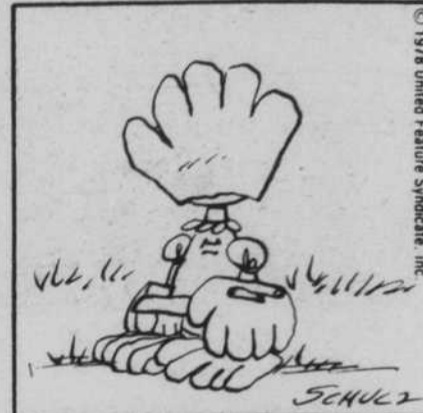
Annual auction set Saturday
