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Coleman is about 85 percent ready, but how well he performs depends on how he feels at race time.

The Ducks will have to count heavily on several athletes if Morris' vision of 130 points is to be realized. Oregon has three Pac-8 leaders going into the meet, discus thrower Dave Voorhees and distance men Rudy Chapa and Alberto Salazar.

Voorhees is also the national leader in the discus with a throw of 206-6 and is the heavy favorite. Number two, USC's Darrel Elder, has only thrown 193-9 to date. Along with his top discus marks, Voorhees is the conference's fourth best shot putter.

Chapa has the best time in the conference at 1,500 meters and right behind him is teammate Matt Centrowitz and Washington State's Henry Rono. Oregon's Bruce Green follows Rono to give

the Ducks three strong entrants in what looks to be the meet's most exciting event.

Salazar will be challenged in the 10,000 by Washington State's Samson Kimombwa and Joshua Kimeto, neither of whom have run the distance this year. Kimombwa is the current world record holder in the event.

Rono, who has set world's records in both the 5,000 and steeplechase this spring, is favored in both events and will likely run in the 10,000 if Washington State is close to the leaders and needs points.

Oregon pole vaulter Tom Hintnaus apparently has recovered from the two falls he suffered while vaulting and could be a factor in the vault. Although UCLA's Mike Tully has gone a foot higher than most other challengers, there's five vaulters between 17-0 and 17-3 1/4, one of whom is Hintnaus.

Ducks say 'aloha' to year's end with six game series at Hawaii

While most of us will be celebrating the arrival of Hawaiian-type weather over the weekend, the Oregon baseball team will be doing it in the real stuff.

The Ducks leave today enroute to Honolulu for their last games of the season against Hawaii. Currently 23-19 on the season, Oregon coach Mel Krause sees the trip as important for the program as well as a break from the Eugene atmosphere — which lately has been nothing but rain.

"It will help the program in several ways," explains Krause about the six-day junket. "The University

of Hawaii is a very good team so it'll give us a chance to measure our ability with that of a very good team."

"It's also an excellent recruiting trip in that players that I'm interested in getting for next year will see that we've gone to Hawaii. It might make them listen a little more closely because naturally they'd like to make that same trip someday," Krause said.

The games will be played as three separate doubleheaders on Saturday, Sunday and Tuesday. All of the contests will be against the University of Hawaii.

Of the 21 players Krause has selected to make the trip, nine are pitchers. Krause indicated Dean Kegler and Glen Fisher will start in

Saturday's twinbill and that he will wait until he sees the Rainbows' line-up to pick the starters for the remaining games.

Excluding the Hawaiian swing, Krause stated he is pleased with the way the season has turned out — a year that saw the Ducks finish a half game ahead of Oregon State for second place.

"It's been a lot better year than last year in wins and losses and players' attitudes," he said. "I'm pleased with the progress we've made."

But the season isn't over yet and Krause realizes too much sunning and funning might dim an otherwise bright season.

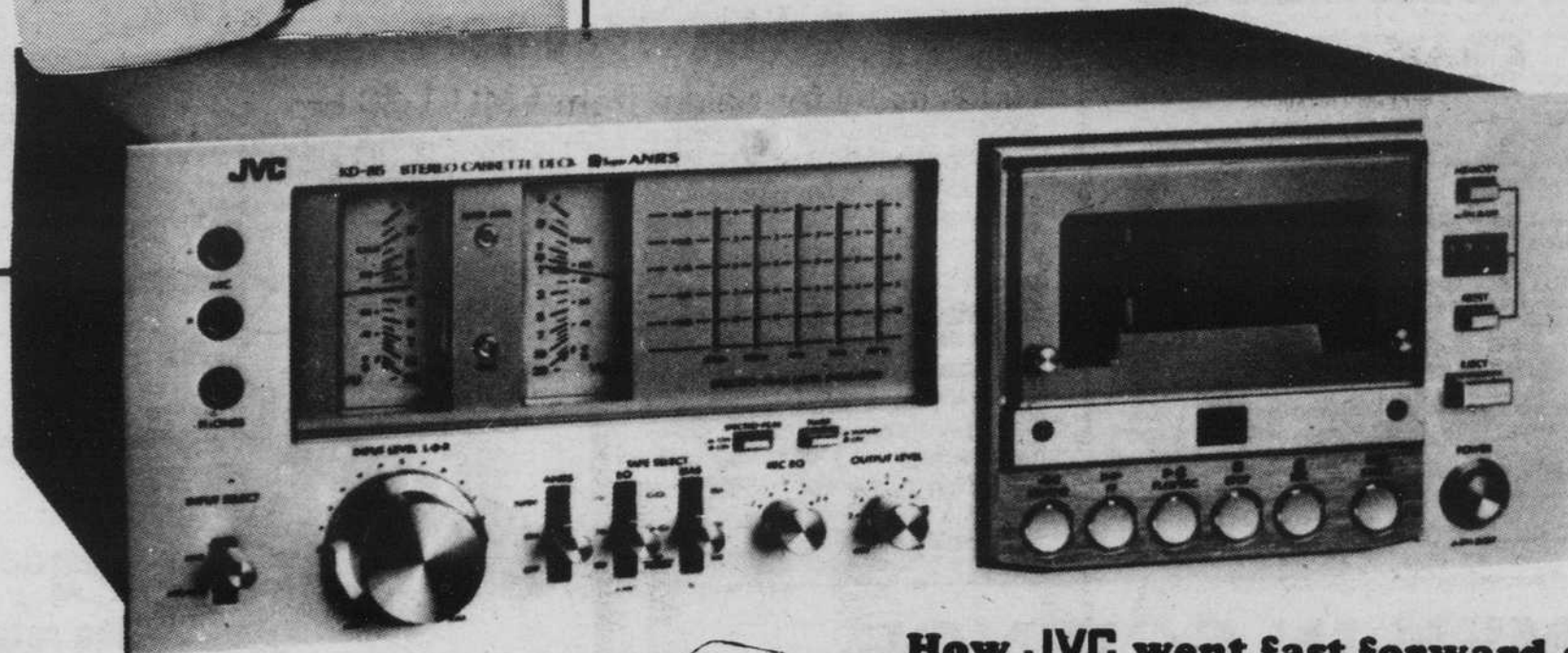
"My intention is to go over there and win," stated Krause.



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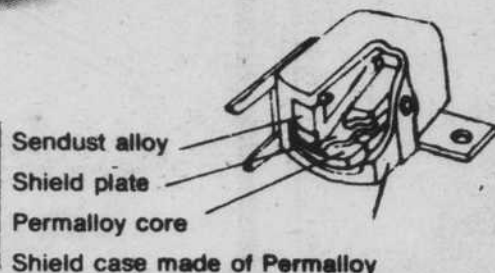
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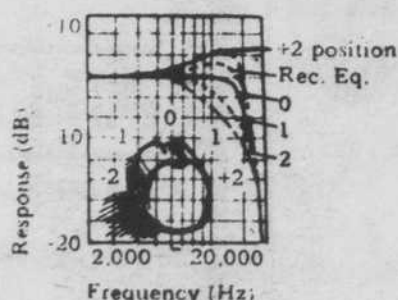
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
