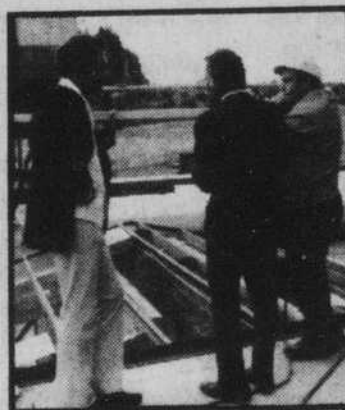


YOU'LL LIKE THE CHANGE!

Bob Wood grew up with nine sisters and brothers in the Black Hills of South Dakota, a rural area with high unemployment. He was only eleven years old when his father was killed. After graduation from the eighth grade, Bob started a search for work — hitch-hiking across the country looking for odd jobs. He worked at filling stations, on farms, in construction, as a truck driver and as a fireman.



Bob and his wife, Shari, moved to Eugene in 1963. At age 29, without the benefit of a high school education, he entered Lane Community College, then transferred to the University of Oregon and earned a B.A. in Geography and a Master's in Education. He taught Social Studies and was very active in the Democratic Party. Bob worked on legislative matters for the Oregon Education Association and for a religious organization to establish low income and Senior Citizen Housing.

Following a term on the City Council, Bob was elected Lane County Commissioner. Bob Wood's service on a long list of governmental advisory committees is broad and varied. He is extremely well-qualified to serve all of the people of District Four. He understands there is more than one issue facing us.

THE ELDERLY:

Bob has worked hard with programs that will help senior citizens keep their homes and their dignity: health care, meals on wheels, senior home repair and many more.

JOBS AND BUSINESSES:

Federal Economic Development programs should reflect the varied needs of District Four accurately. The most effective way to save jobs and create new ones is to work with local governments, local business people, local unions and the citizens in each community.

HOUSING:

The cost of financing has pushed the dream of home ownership out of the reach of many American families. Basic shelter needs will be a priority concern of Bob's in Congress.

Public Utilities will insure a more stable rate structure and greater public accountability. Leadership is needed to inspire these changes.

ENVIRONMENT:

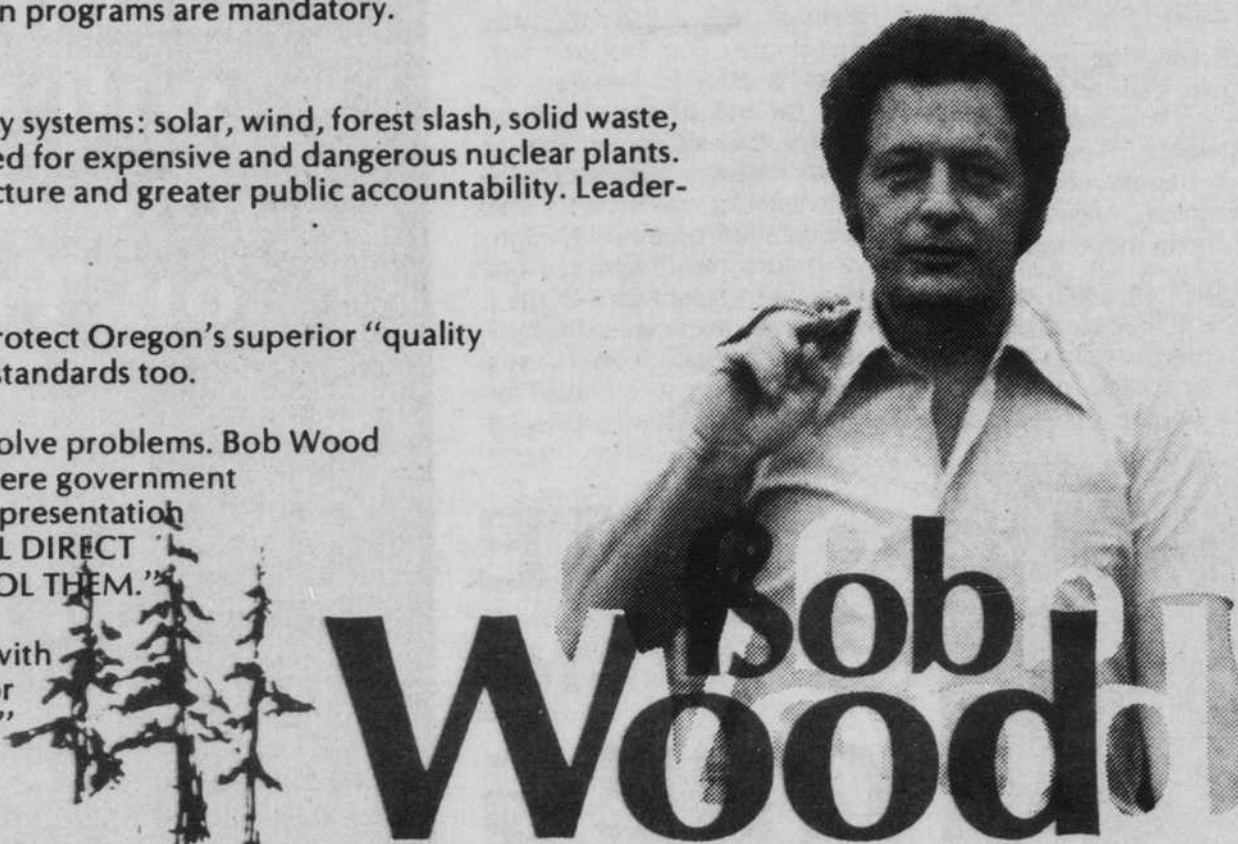
Future generations are depending on us to protect Oregon's superior "quality of life". We can provide jobs and maintain high standards too.
