"We are in the process of recruiting two more," says Diana Hovick, rally squad adviser.

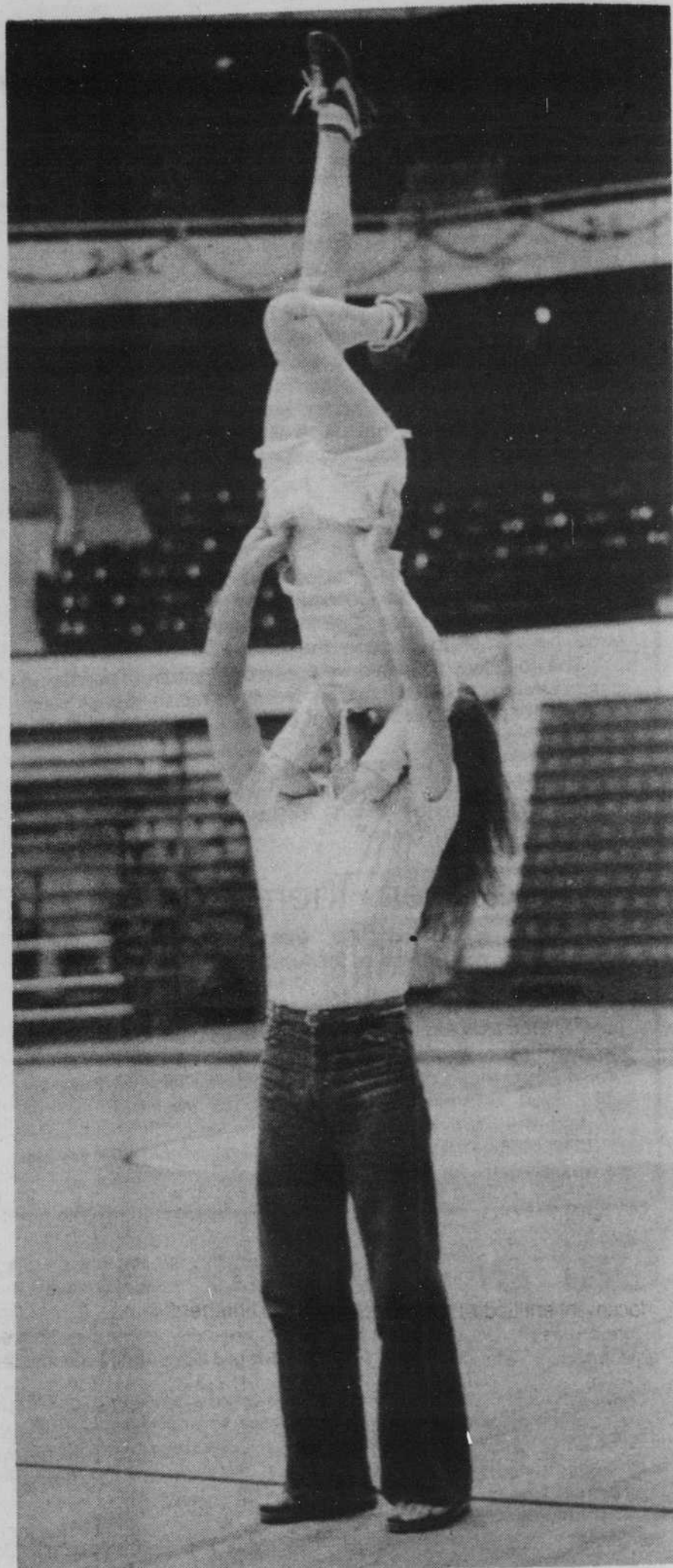
Erickson says being chosen for rally was the greatest thing that ever happened to him.

The University Year for ACTION program (UYA) has been awarded \$131,638.22 for continuation of the project. ACTION, the federal agency which directs the Peace Corps and VISTA, made the grant.

Anita Runyan, assistant professor of Community Service and Public Affairs (CSPA) heads the project. The program provides 12 months of field experience for students majoring in CSPA of social work. This is the program's third year.

UYA operated as a part of the School of Community Service and Public Affairs until April 1, when it became part of the Division of Developmental Studies of the College of Education.
