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1,500. Clary was somewhat surprised he finished first since the returning steeple champ, James Munyala from Texas-El Paso was in his heat.

"I didn't expect to win," Clary said. "Knowing Munyala, that's the way he likes to run, from the back."

Munyala said he wasn't trying to set the track on fire or win the heat, just qualify. "I know it will be hard to win the race," he said about the final on Saturday when he will have to run against Rono. "But nobody knows what will happen."

When asked if he could stay with Rono, Munyala said he was hoping to. Clary said he thinks Munyala might be able to keep up with the swift Kenyan, but he's going to stay out of Rono's way if Rono decided to take off.

"It would be a mistake if anyone goes out with him, but they won't be able to hold the pace."

Centrowitz took charge of his heat from the start and finished a second and a half up on second place finisher Tom Diuts from Western Michigan.

"That was a good heat. There were a lot of guys in there with faster times than me," Centrowitz said. "I just ran the race the way I felt. Most people didn't want to move before the 500 yard mark.

They didn't want to face the wind twice. I heard the three-quarters time and I looked back and couldn't believe the yardage I had on the field."

Rudy Chapa finished third in his heat of the 5,000, behind Washington State's Joel Cheruiyot and Texas-El Paso's Rodolpho Gomez after starting at the end of the pack and moving into contention during the first mile.

"I was actually looking past this one, waiting for Saturday," Chapa said. I stayed back early to avoid getting stepped on."

Tom Hintnaus qualified for the pole vault finals on Saturday with a jump of 17-0. He will be joined by seven others, three of which are

from the Pac-8 — Mike Tully and Charlie Brown from UCLA and Steve Orowetz from Washington.

Hintnaus said the incredibly long qualifying — about six and a half hours — hurt his performance

somewhat.

"Sitting in the sun all day, warming up, cooling down, I really had to muster up a lot of strength for my last one," Hintnaus said of his qualifying vault of 17 feet.

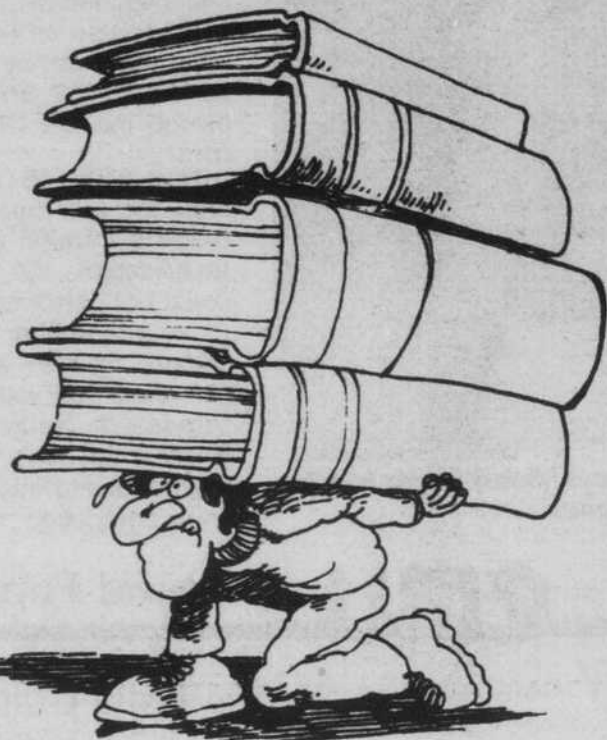
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
