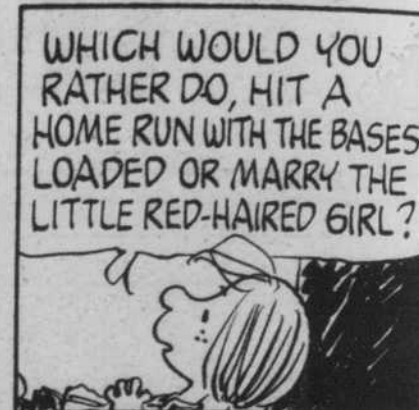
People interested in volunteering to work at the dinner may eat free if they volunteer ahead of time with Arlene Murfin at 485-4032. She can also answer questions about the school.

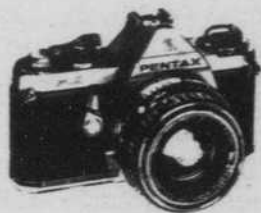
