Clary's time in the steeple was over ten seconds lower than his previous best, and he thinks it was the opening pace that helped.

"The pace was fast, 4:33 for the first mile," Clary said. "That's the fastest I've come through the first mile."

"I should have gone out with (Henry) Marsh and (Hillary) Tuwei. My only fault was letting Marsh go by and not following him. I hesitated when Marsh took off because I was not sure how I'd feel the rest of the race if I extended myself at that point."

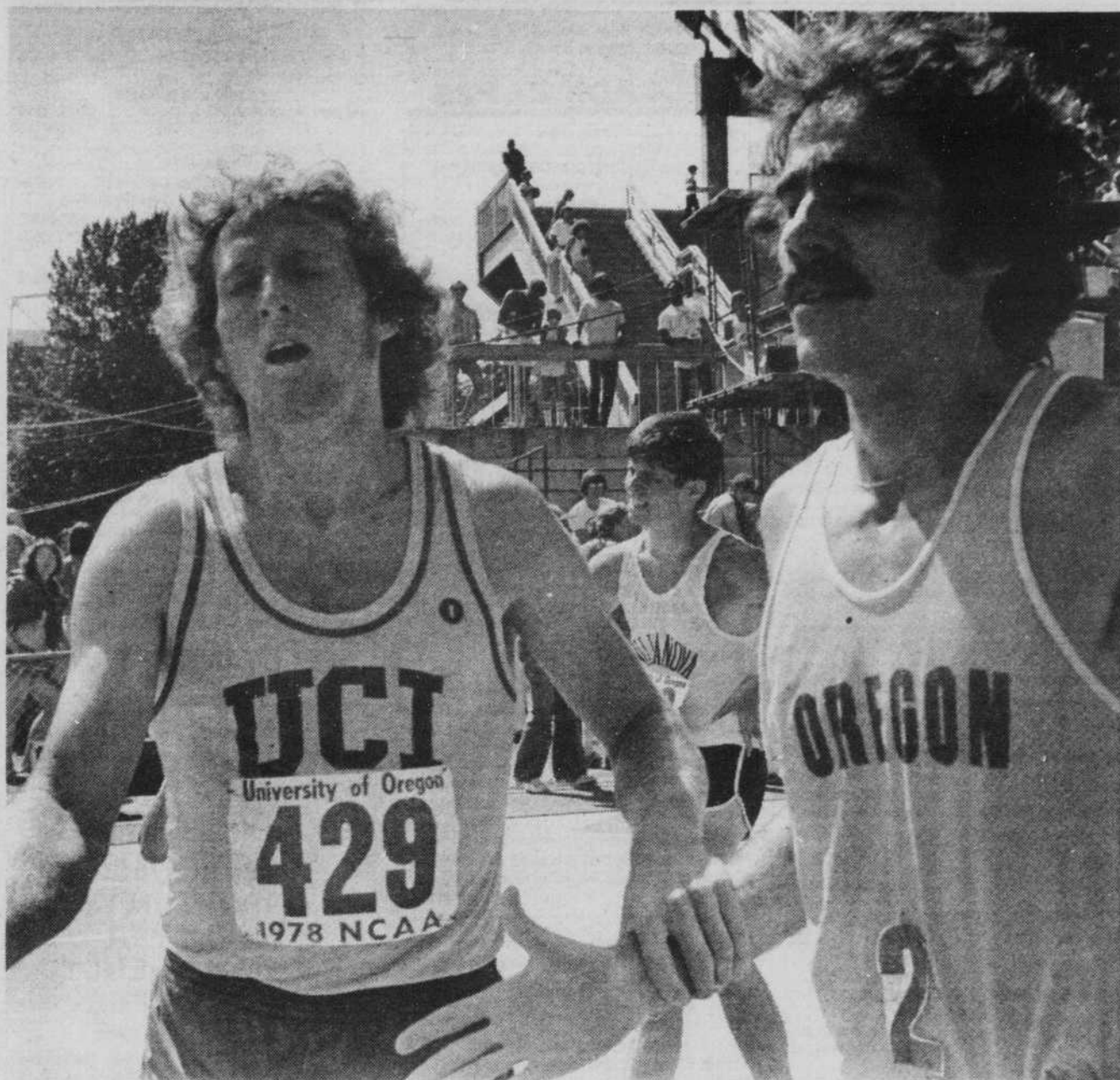
