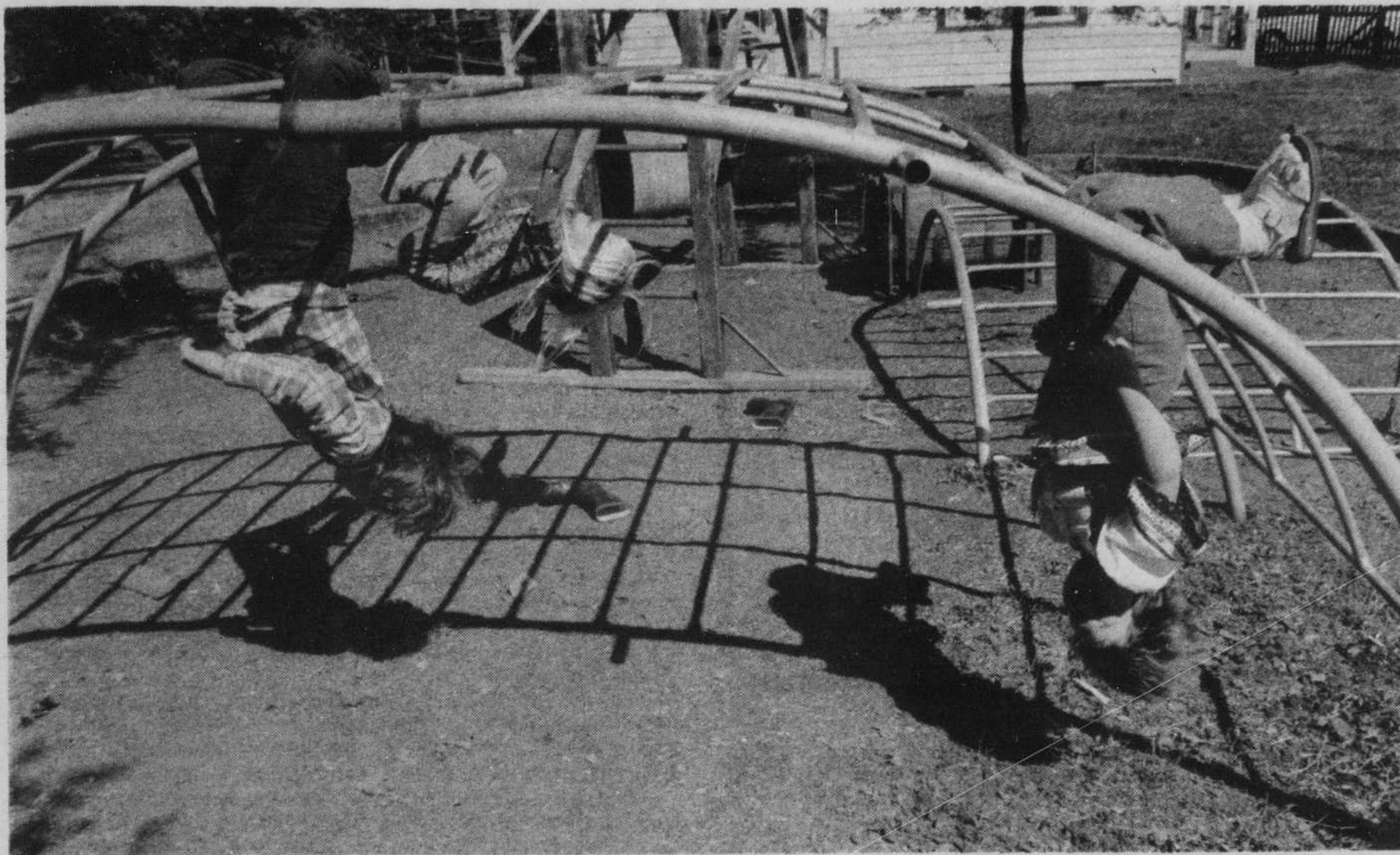

## ESCAPE the campus, earn summer credit

Students interested in volunteer community service projects can arrange for credit this summer through ESCAPE (Every Student Caring About Personalized Education).

About 600 to 700 students worked with ESCAPE during the academic year and Alan Podawiltz, ESCAPE services division head, expects 130 students to enroll this summer. Typically, ESCAPE has many more requests than it can fill.

"We have 500 requests for people for this summer alone," says Podawiltz. "We can be pretty selective about placements for people."

The basic format for working in ESCAPE allows the student to receive one credit hour for three hours of work per week. Each student also works on a term project designed to be of value to participating agencies after the ESCAPE student has finished his tutoring or work experience.

All first-term ESCAPE students attend a seminar to develop communication skills and become familiar with field work services.

Involvement for ESCAPE students can range from school tutoring to completing a business internship to planning a recreational program, but community services will be the focus of this summer's plan.

A variety of programs this summer allows for students to work with the physically or mentally handicapped, in recreation or sports programs, in corrections, in a multi-service agency, with the elderly, with day care centers and pre-schools.

The tumbling program for this age group includes a final class that will present a review for parents and friends of the tumblers.

Day care for small children is available at the University Child Care Center on the ground floor of the EMU and at the Lane Community College Day Care Center.

The University center, headed by new Program Director Rachel Katz, provides one adult care-giver to each four children. It

accepts children from two to five years old, with hourly rates from \$.92 for four and five-year-olds to \$1.05 for two and three-year-olds.

Katz says the center is expanding its outdoor play area. University students have priority in enrolling their children, with registration on a first-come, first-served basis every Monday between 9-10 a.m. The center is open from 8-4:30 p.m. week days. Information is available at 686-4345.

The LCC child care center is accepting community enrollment this summer and still has some openings. It accepts a maximum of 30 children, with an adult-child ratio of one or more to five.

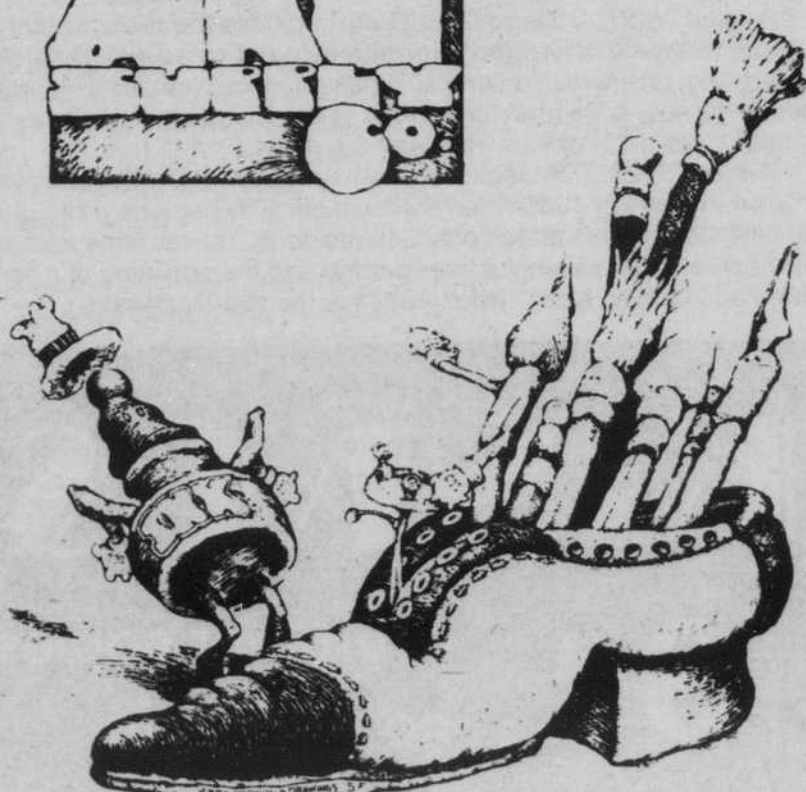
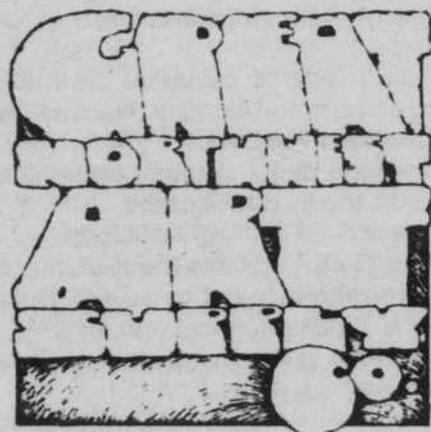
The center, open week days from 7:30-5 p.m., charges hourly rates on a sliding scale from \$.52 to \$.92 hourly, based on income and number of family members. Information about registration is available from Barbara Cox at 747-4501, extension 264.

The University Child Care and Development Center at 1511 Moss St. is filled to capacity right now, but Rosalind Kotz says the center has a waiting list and will always accept applications. They take children from three months to 10 years; care includes a latch-key program during the school year for elementary-age children.

The Crafts Center at the

EMU, on the ground floor, offers some classes just for children — information is available at 686-4361.
