City fires 'inconsistent' woodstove inspector

A two-month controversy over the city's inspection program of woodstoves manufactured and installed in the area has claimed its first victim.

A city inspector who handled woodstove inspections for the past six years was fired last week because of alleged inconsistencies

with his inspections.

Lyle Lamont, 61, who was given a letter of dismissal last Monday, was the center of a controversy that began two months ago when seven area woodstove manufacturers charged the city and Lamont with subjecting their businesses to "unreasonable and capricious

action" through inconsistent inspection procedures.

Those manufacturers, Mike Duval of J & J Enterprises, Ken Hussey and Doug Johnson of Mannan Building Supplies, Thomas Lichty of Oregon Woodstove Company, John Orlando of Oregon Steel Fabricating, Fred

Winham of Radke Stove Distributing and G.M. McCormack of McCormack Consulting Engineers, charged in a letter sent to the Eugene city council April 12 that Lamont and the city's inspection procedures were inconsistent. Some of the irregularities may have caused monetary losses to several of the woodstove businesses in the area, the letter said.

Following the letter, an investigation into the claims by the city police department and the city manager's office failed to turn up any evidence of criminal intent on the part of Lamont or the city's inspection division of the Public Works Department.

The investigation did find, however, that the inconsistency charges made by the manufacturer

was correct. A program of regular woodstove inspections and public information about those stoves that have passed testing standards set by the International Conference of Building Officials (ICBO) are now incorporated into the inspection procedure.

Lamont, who has worked as a teacher for Oregon State University, Lane Community College, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and Arizona State University, says he was made a scapegoat for the inspection division because of the accusations by the area manufacturers.

Lamont also says the charges made by the manufacturers are false and he will work through the city's grievance procedures to clear his name.
