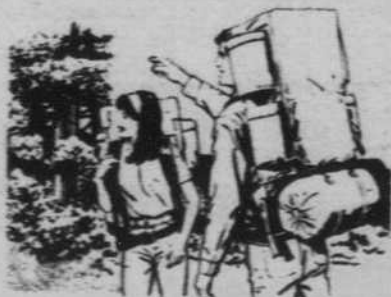

New program offers study on ecosystems

An affiliation between Lane Community College (LCC) and the Cerro Gordo Center for Creative Community will enable students to participate and gain college credit with a summer workshop program on ecosystemic community design.

The summer program, which runs from Saturday to August 26, allows students to gain credits and become involved in a model community, which is being planned, designed and built by its future residents, incorporating alternative methods such as the use of solar energy, the recycling of organic by-products and experimental methods of organic food production.

Cerro Gordo, founded in 1971, is a 1200-acre site located five miles east of Cottage Grove.

The cost of the eight-week workshop is \$650, which includes \$475 for tuition and \$175 for food and lodging.

Fifty organ crawlers visit

Beall Concert Hall will be one of the stops when a group of organists making a tour of notable organs in the Northwest visit Eugene. The tour, called an organ crawl because people used to crawl inside pipe organs to see how they worked, will bring about 50 organists to the campus Monday.

Two well-known recitalists, Margaret Irwin-Brandon and Mark Brombaugh, will perform at 12:30 p.m. on the Jurgen Ahrend organ in Beall hall during the visit.

From Beall hall, the organ crawl will move on to the United Lutheran Church, 2230 Washington St., to see and hear the organ built by another local craftsman, Ken Coulter. The tour is being arranged as a follow-up event for the biennial convention of the American Guild of Organists being held in Seattle in late June.

Workshop aids seniors

Senior citizens who feel they aren't being treated fairly when they visit their physician will be able to learn about rights as patients, thanks to a one-day workshop today by the Community Health and Education Center (CHEC).

The workshop is one of several classes and workshops that are part of the CHEC summer program. The senior citizen workshop, "How to Survive a Visit to the Doctor's Office," will teach seniors the key to understanding what a trip to the physician means, the rights of senior patients and how to get information about a medical condition.

It will be conducted by Harry Krulwich and Sandy Boyson, an area physician and a licensed practical nurse.
