Though lacking a permanent headquarters, *NewMime* is well worth watching for with its multi-faceted form that blends theater with juggling, yoga, music and gymnastics.



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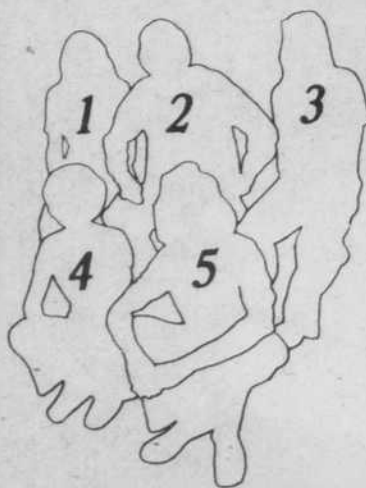
