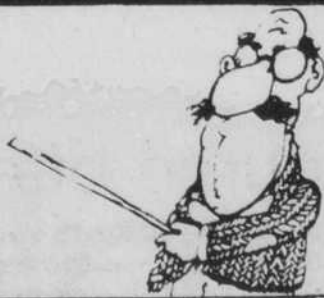

The following is a list of options open for graduate students needing financial aid. Various kinds of aid include grants, post-doctoral and graduate fellowships and research grants.

Office of Research and Development, Employment and Training Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, 601 D St., N.W. Room 9100, Washington, D.C. 20213. Doctoral dissertation fellowships to support research in employment and training. Study areas include apprenticeship training, discrimination in employment, groups with special needs, productivity, work and welfare, and worker motivation, amongst others. All requirements for the degree must be finished with the exception of the dissertation at the start of research. Students must be nominated by their institutions. Students with partially completed dissertations are also eligible. Deadlines: December 1, March 1, June 1, and September 1.

Graduate Research Fellowship Program, Office of Criminal Justice Education and Training, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, U.S. Department of Justice, Washington, D.C., 20531.

Support for doctoral dissertation research in crime-related fields of study. Candidates must have finished course work. A concept paper must be submitted along with a budget and a letter of support from the sponsoring university. Deadline: October 1, 1978.

Business and Professional Women's Foundation, 2012 Massachusetts Ave., N.W., Washington, D.C., 20036. Support for doctoral candidates or post-doctoral scholars. Subject of dissertation must pertain to the economic, educational, political, social or psychological factors affecting working women. Deadline: January 1, 1979.

Amelia Earhart Fellowship Awards, Zonta International, 59 E. Van Buren St., Chicago, IL 60605. Fellowships for women in aerospace-related science and engineering. Previous winners have been in the fields of astronomy, molecular biology, space medicine, astrophysics, aerospace engineering, and related fields. Students who have received awards in past years have been from 20 countries. Deadline: December 31, 1978.

National Foundation for Jewish Culture, 122 E. 42nd St., New York 10017. Doctoral dissertation support for students in a field of Jewish studies, or in a field in which the dissertation is integrally related to Jewish community life or institutions. All academic requirements except the dissertation must be completed. Students must be U.S. citizens. Deadline: December 31, 1978.

Learning Fellowship on Social Change, Inter-American Foundation, 1515 Wilson Blvd., Rosslyn, VA 22209. Pre- and post-doctoral fellowships for research in Latin America and the Caribbean. Topics of interest include appropriate technology for small farmers, cultural expression and social change, the productive role of women in urban slums, problems of migration, and similar areas. Deadline: December 5, 1978.

Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, Women's Studies Program, Box 642, Princeton, NJ 08540. For support of doctoral dissertation research about women. Candidates must have completed all requirements except the dissertation. Deadline: November 1, 1978.

American-Scandinavian Foundation, 127 E. 73rd St., New York 10021. A variety of fellowship opportunities to study in the Scandinavian countries. Some programs are open to undergraduates as well as graduate students. Deadline: November 1, 1978 (for all programs).

American Numismatic Society, Broadway at 156th St., New York 10032. Doctoral dissertation support in the humanities and social sciences. Students must have completed all requirements for the degree except the dissertation. The dissertation must be on a topic in which the use of numismatics plays a significant part. Deadline: March 1, 1979.
