

Orchestra tryouts begin

Auditions for vacant positions in the Eugene Symphony Orchestra for the 1978-79 season will be held Tuesday and Wednesday in the South Eugene High School band room. They will begin at 7 p.m. and all interested persons should call either the Symphony office (687-0020) or Orchestra Manager Laura Martin (686-1565), for details.

The openings are as follows: Principals; concertmaster (violin I), principal cello and principal oboe (this latter position is for a one year appointment only). Other positions open are in the violin I and II, viola and cello sections. Also open are positions for bassoon, french horn, trumpet and tuba (the tuba being only for one year).

The Tuesday audition is for Concertmaster, all section leaders and all strings. The Wednesday audition is for all wind instruments. Candidates should be prepared to play a piece of their own choosing and to sight read alone as well as with an ensemble.

Quilters show, demonstrate creative work

The Lane County Museum, in cooperation with the Pioneer Quilters, will present "The Unbroken Thread"; an Exhibit of American Quilts from the 1800's to the Present Day, through Oct. 1 at the museum, 740 W. 13th Ave., Eugene.

The American quilt has undergone a revival in the 1970s with many quilt-makers going beyond the traditional and inventing new designs and forms. Although some new quilts are almost unrecognizable by traditional standards, there is an "unbroken thread" that ties the quilts of today with those of the past. This exhibit attempts to reveal the thread of craftsmanship, love and endurance that ties all quilts and quilt-makers together.

Members of the Pioneer Quilters will be at the exhibit daily to demonstrate hand quilting. There will also be informative demonstrations of various kinds of quilt making.

Special museum hours for the nine day exhibit will be Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sunday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is free.

Course offered for shy

A course designed to help students become more socially successful, Managing Communication Apprehension, will again be taught by Susan Glaser, assistant professor of Speech.

Glaser says the course, numbered RhCm 199, is a practical one for students who often find themselves in situations in which they would like to talk, but feel too anxious, or are unable to think of anything to say.

It is for students who are having difficulty meeting people and making friends with those they do meet, she says.

"We will help the students who take the class to develop interpersonal goals that are important to them and workable effective strategies for achieving those goals."

Glaser served on the staff of the Pennsylvania State University Retention Center for four years prior to coming to the University in 1975.

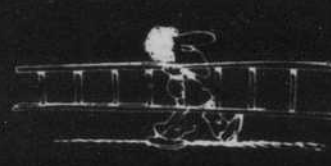
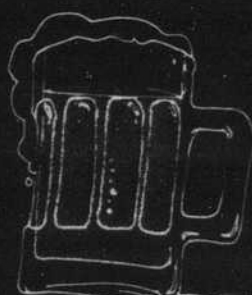
Advisory position open

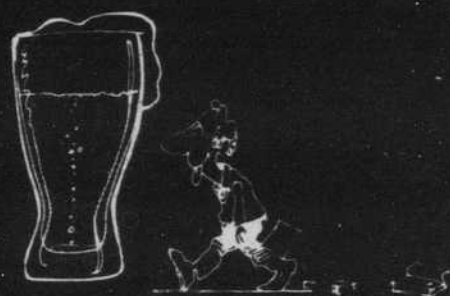
Interested persons should submit an application to the Community Relations Department no later than Friday.
