

ETAC reps needed

The Lane County Board of Commissioners are recruiting applications from interested citizens to serve as representatives for the Lane County Employment and Training Advisory Council (ETAC).

The Lane County ETAC advises the Board of Commissioners on allocation of CETA funds, as well as providing advice, planning, policy and program evaluation for employment and training services.

Currently 14 vacancies exist representing the following groups:

- 1) Youth - a member who is under 22
- 2) A representative of the Oregon State Employment Service
- 3) Veterans - a member of a veteran's organization
- 4) A member of a major local labor organization
- 5) A member of a private sector business organization, including cooperatives
- 6) A member of a rural education district
- 7) A member of an urban school district
- 8) A member of a seniors' group or organization who is over 55 years of age (this appointment will be recommended by the Senior Services Subcommittee)
- 9) A representative of a coordinating organization whose members are non-profit organizations qualified under 501 IRS status, but not including 501(C) 1
- 10) A representative of an organization for handicapped persons who is handicapped
- 11) - 14) Three at-large representatives.

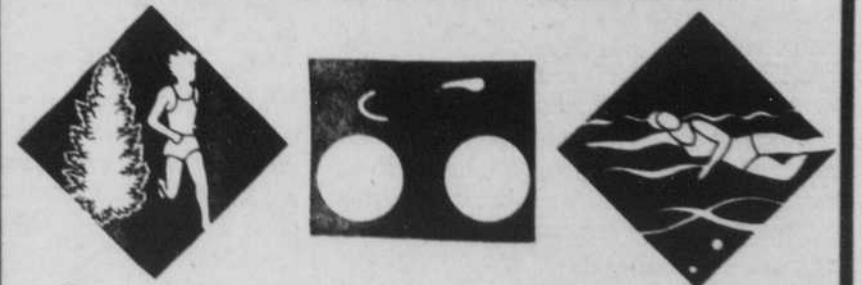
