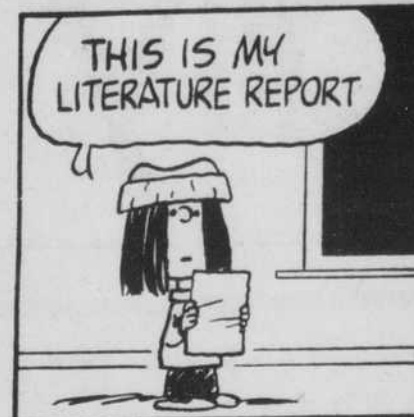
AAACT child, family therapy scheduled

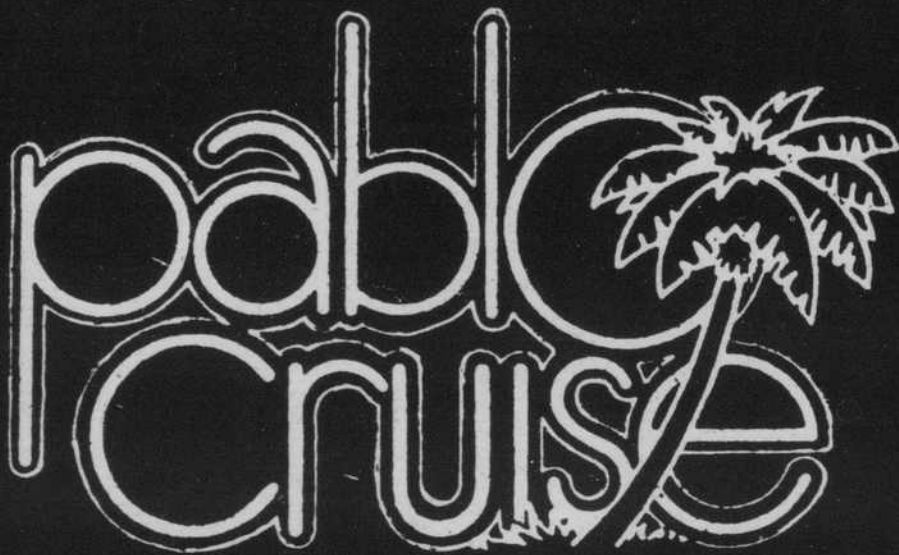
