team's great hustle and spirit, but in the end it was breaks and the opposition's talent that resulted in the Ducks dropping a pair of Northwest Collegiate Soccer Conference (NCSC) matches Friday and Saturday.

Seattle Pacific beat Oregon Friday afternoon, 3-1, while Washington defeated the Ducks, 1-0, Saturday evening.

Davis had said the Ducks needed to win at least one of the two matches for his team to improve on its fourth place league finish of last year. And although the two losses didn't end that possibility, it will be a tough haul for the 0-2 Ducks, who have only seven league matches remaining.

On Friday Oregon fell behind Seattle Pacific's Falcons 2-0 after the first half. The visitors used sharp passing to set up their first goal, a 20-yarder by John Hennessey.

The second goal was controversial. The linesman ruled off-

side as Bruce Rainey placed a perfect pass over the outstretched hand of Oregon goalie Ross Crook and under the crossbar. In spite of the linesman's call, the referee allowed the goal.

The Falcons put the game away when Kevin Bloutoff scored on a penalty kick after Duck defender Brad Meeder committed a foul in the penalty box.

In the Seattle Pacific contest, Scott Meiggs, who was pressed into front line service because leading scorer Eric Zook's leg injury knocked home the lone Oregon goal from 25 yards out.

In Saturday's game, the Ducks and Huskies battled to a 0-0 half-time standoff, but then a bad break rolled Oregon's way. At the 10 minute mark of the second half, a Husky corner kick was accidentally kicked in by Oregon's Mike Gorman. Though Oregon had several scoring chances, nothing came of them and the Ducks ended up losing.

The Washington State game was totally different, however. "We were just outclassed. That's what it comes down to," Oregon coach Jim Sernoffsky said.

Oregon's only goal was scored by Sandy Young, which at the time tied the contest 1-1. That was it for the Duck but the Cougars scored twice more in the first half to take a 3-1 lead, and added three more goals in the second half to finish the rout.
