

# King Tut weekend offered peanuts <sup>®</sup>

The University has about 15 openings for an Oct. 20-23 tour to Seattle that will include a special guided tour of the King Tutankhamen exhibit, University Alumni Relations Director Lois McCarty says.

McCarty said about 285 persons have signed for the trip which is open to the public and organized especially for University alumni and friends of the Museum of Art.

Included in the Friday through Monday trip will be transportation to and from Seattle on Amtrack, accommodations for three nights at a downtown Seattle hotel, art tours of the city, dinner and a lecture on "The Treasures of Tutankhamen" and a reception and guided tour of the King Tutankhamen exhibit. Cost is \$150.

In addition, tour participants will have the option of attending the Ducks football game with the University of Washington Oct. 21. Reserved seat tickets for the game are \$9 per person.
