Soccer men travel this week

The Oregon men's club soccer team takes its 0-2 Northwest Collegiate Soccer Conference (NCSC) record to the state of Washington this weekend for two matches.

On Saturday at 4 p.m., the

Ducks meet Western Washington in Bellingham, then travel down Puget Sound to battle Pacific Lutheran in Tacoma on Sunday at 2 p.m.

Last year, Oregon defeated Western 3-0 and the Lutes 4-0 in matches at Autzen Stadium. Add to that the two schools' current NCSC records (Western is 0-1,

Lutheran is 0-2) and you have the possibility of a couple cakewalks. However, Coach Mike Davis will have none of that.

"Obviously, you can never tell. They'll come out really fighting to win. We'll keep it steady and we'll keep it tight," Davis said. "Obviously, playing away from home you can never tell."

Western Washington's defeat came at the hands of defending league champion Simon Fraser at the Canadian school's field.

"That's a good result up there, so Western Washington should not be underestimated at all," Davis warned.

That is quite a turnaround for the Bellingham school, which finished last in the nine-team league last year and in the process scored only seven goals to its opponents' 23.

An added incentive for the Ducks should be that they were defeated 2-1 the last time they visited Western Washington two years ago.

In Pacific Lutheran, Oregon will be facing a team that has been defeated by large margins by the two teams the Ducks battled closely last weekend. The Lutes have fallen to Washington 12-0 and Seattle Pacific 8-1. Oregon lost to those same teams by 1-0 and 3-1 scores, respectively.

The Ducks will again be without last year's top goal scorer, Erick Zook, who suffered a leg injury Oct. 1 in a pre-season match against Oregon State.

Duck stickers register win

The Oregon women's field hockey team completely dominated Willamette University Tuesday, taking 28 shots on goal compared with just four shots on goal for Willamette while enroute to a 5-1 victory.

Freshman link Veronica Delamotta scored three times for the Ducks, while Hanna Munson and Lynn Manildi each tallied once. Belinda Stillwell recorded an assist on Manildi's goal.

Betsy Allen scored Willamette's lone goal with 10 minutes remaining in the game.

The victory raised Oregon's record to 6-1-1 overall and 4-0 in league play.

Oregon meets Southern Oregon State tonight at 5 p.m. on the field behind South Eugene High School.

Blazer injuries keep mounting

PORTLAND(AP) — The Portland Trail Blazers of the National Basketball Association received more bad medical news when it was learned Maurice Lucas has fractured a spur around the joint of a finger on his right hand.

Team spokesman John White said a splint will be placed on Lucas' hand for at least three weeks, meaning he will miss at least two weeks of regular season play which begins Sunday.

The Blazers can place only three players on the injured reserve list and they have four injured veterans. They must trim their 15-man roster to 11 by 3 p.m. today.

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Tolford bows to appendicitis

Heather Tolford, a sophomore member of the Oregon women's cross-country team, underwent an emergency appendectomy Tuesday night.

Despite acute appendicitis, she ran in the Berkeley Invitational Saturday and finished eighth among the Oregon runners.

She was up and walking around Wednesday at Sacred Heart Hospital and is expected to be running within a week. Coach Tom Heinonen expects her to be ready for the Regional meet Nov. 4.

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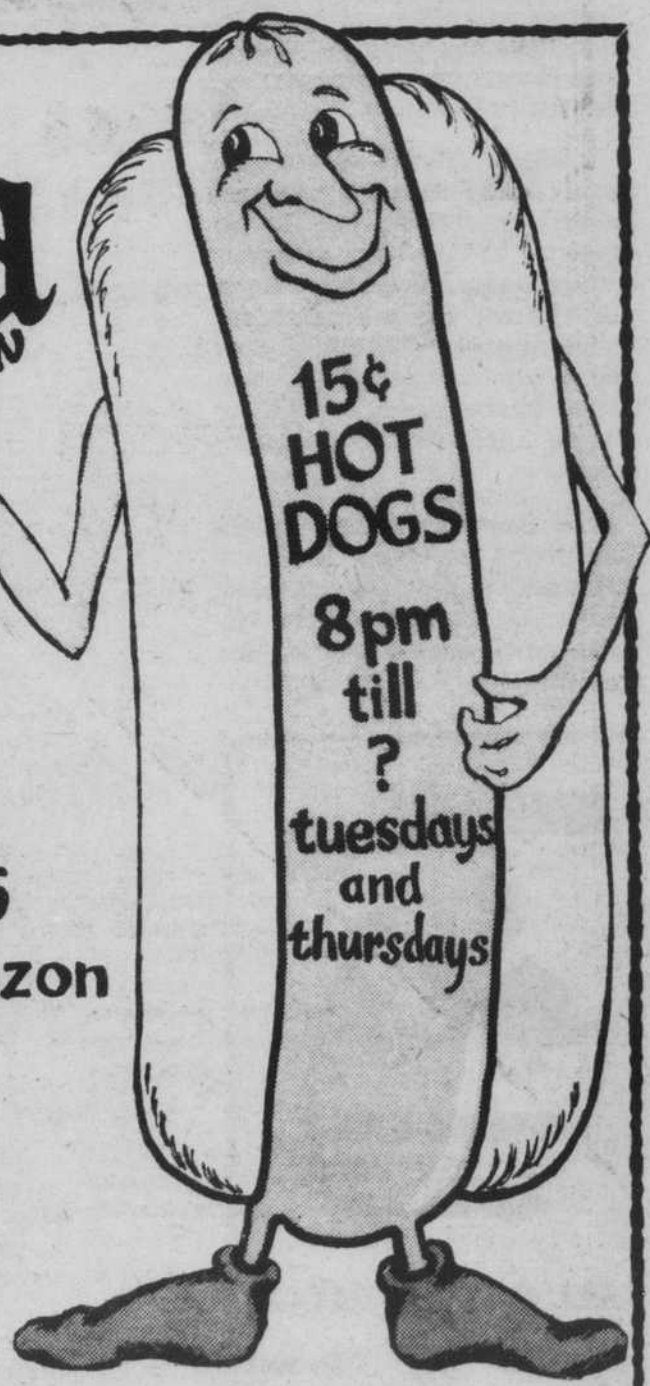
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
