

Food stamp rules limit eligibility

Full-time college students receiving food stamps must be available to work 20 hours a week under new food stamp rules scheduled to take effect next spring.

Joe Shepherd, asst. deputy administrator for the Family Nutrition Program in Washington, D.C., said that full-time students, if they are not already employed 20 hours a week, must actively seek a job. He said students must also seek employment if they are out of school for longer than 30 days.

"In effect," Shepherd said, "the rule is a further restriction."

Current food stamp regulations require students who are not carrying at least six credits at the University to register for work when they apply for food stamp certification. The work registration forms are then sent to the Unemployment office.

The same procedure will be used for

full-time students next spring.

In all, there are 22 new changes in the food stamp program, according to Marlene Hoagland, executive officer of the Adult and Family Services Division in Salem.

Hoagland refused to comment on an Associated Press account of the changes saying, "We don't know yet what the changes are. We will know when they are printed in the Federal Register (a record of Congressional activities)."

"We have asked repeatedly for a verbal comment from the Department of Agriculture," Hoagland said, "but we haven't received one."

"The feds are saying the changes will be implemented Jan. 1, 1979," she said. "This will put some states in an uproar, because we will have to make new changes in a major program and change our computer programs by the end of October."

One certain change in the program is that food stamp users will receive change in cash up to \$.99, Shepherd said. Previous regulations required stores to give customers receipts usable only at the store that issued the receipt.

"Cash will be given as change to give the consumer more flexibility,"

Shepherd said. "Many people, for one reason or another, don't always make it back to the same stores and use of the receipts cuts down on food stamp benefits."

Shepherd said grocers will be policed to observe any abuse problems with the new rule.

Fed orders post office hook-up

A mandatory injunction ordering Springfield's tiny Rainbow Water District to provide water service to the U.S. Postal Service's new sorting center was granted Thursday in U. S. District Court.

Judge Robert Belloni also ordered the Postal Service to pay a disputed \$36,000 charge pending a final court decision on the legality of the charge.

The Postal Service claims the charge is a tax

and that the Service is constitutionally exempt. The district says that the charge, a benefited property fee, covers the actual cost of pipe installation and ditch digging. The district maintains it is a fee to cover costs, not a tax.

The decision to sue the water district was made by the Washington, D.C., Postal Service headquarters. Local postal authorities were given no voice in the decision.

Music group performs
