

Students protest Shah

Two local Iranian student groups and the Revolutionary Communist Youth Brigade (RCYB) have joined forces this week to protest the shah's government in Iran.

Forty days after the start of a series of bloody uprisings in the capital city of Teheran, the groups will be boycotting classes this week to commemorate the event.

A teach-in will take place at 12:30 p.m. today in the EMU. The groups will ask students to

wear armbands reading "Down with the Shah! U.S. Hands off Iran."

Ahmad Mobarez, member of the ISA's University branch, encourages all Iranian students (about 60) at the University to boycott classes, while other students will be asked to wear the armbands.

The armbands will be available at the RCYB table today in the EMU, and also in 334 EMU.

GTF working time over the entire school year, thereby including Christmas and spring vacations. The union would exclude these holiday periods by counting only those weeks that fall within each academic term.

Whether or not to include holidays in computing workload obviously has bearing on the contract's cost to the University. The union proposal calls for a lower total of working hours per year. To make up the difference, the University would have to either hire more GTFs or raise the FTE appointment level of some now in the GTF labor force.

Another problem is the contract's strike clause, an item common to labor contracts by which a union agrees not to strike

during the life of the agreement. Organized labor's reverence for union solidarity borders on the religious—"the picket line is sac-

red," Dodds has declared—and the GTF wants to add a sentence to the strike clause saying, "However, nothing in this article shall require employees to act as strike breakers or to cross a legal primary picket line of another labor organization."

The University points out that Oregon law defines such action by public employees under contract as illegal strike action. Ratteree counters that the law's language is cloudy enough to merit a court ruling; meanwhile, the GTF doesn't want itself or its individual members to be forced to violate labor solidarity.



City seeks cycle designs

The Eugene Bicycle Committee is sponsoring a design contest for two new covered bicycle parking structures to be located in the downtown area.

The project has a \$10,000 budget for the design and construction of two structures, including racks.

Entries may be in the form of a conceptual model or drawing, and all entries will become the property of the city.

The structures should be the size of two parking spaces and have the ability to accommodate a maximum number of bicycles.

Deadline for receipt of the proposals is noon, Nov. 20. Proposals are to be turned in at the front desk, third floor, City Hall II, 858 Pearl St.

Proposals will be judged on simplicity of construction, portability, durability and ease of maintenance, ability to protect bicycles from rain, and cost of reproduction.

Designs should allow for natural and street light illumination through the roof for the locking of bikes. Conflict with cars and pedestrians should be considered.

The selection of the winning design(s) will be made on Nov. 21 by the bicycle committee and the parks design staff.

The city will pay \$250 for each winning design and may then reproduce the prototype for use within the city without further royalty.

The parking structures are destined for parking lots on Eighth Avenue and Pearl Street and Eighth Avenue and Olive Street, according to Dave Spradlin, bicycle coordinator.

Spradlin said the committee would like to have the structures done by June 1979, but that it would depend on the design.

The winning entrant may be hired to complete construction drawings.

Design credit will be shown on the two structures in the form of a plaque or sign.
