

Financial aid available for studies abroad

Opportunities for financial aid are open to students planning to study abroad through a University program next fall.

"If a student wants to go badly enough, he can find a way," says Thomas Mills, director of International Student Services. Mills coordinates University-approved foreign study.

Kathey Allely, University foreign

study specialist, says students who plan to study abroad next year should start planning their schedule this fall.

Cost of the programs, Allely says, ranges from \$2850 for an undergraduate spending the year in Poitiers, France, to as high as \$4600 a year at Waseda University in Tokyo. Estimates include housing, most meals, tuition and

fees, but do not include airfare. Financial aid may be used at foreign universities while studying through approved programs.

Scholarships for students planning to study abroad may also be available from some departments, Allely says.

Courses taken through University-approved programs are directly recorded on University

transcripts, with a notation that the student has studied abroad, says Mills. University-approved overseas courses may also be applied to residency requirements, he adds.

Deadlines are:

• Oct. 31 for six-months of study in Guadalajara, Mexico, beginning in January, 1979.

• February 15 for programs in London and Reading, England; Stuttgart and Cologne, Germany; Avignon and Poitiers, France; and Tokyo, Japan, beginning next fall.

• May 15 for study in Bruekelen, The Netherlands, beginning next fall.

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"We were going to sell advertising, but that fell through. That sunk us worse into debt and made the book late."

According to Doug Benson, IFC chair, "We had administrative disagreements with the yearbook staff, because after all the money we gave them, they still wanted to charge \$25 for each page of ASUO coverage. Our standing debt for the 1977 and the 1978 yearbooks is \$35,000," Nilson says.

Lack of communication may have contributed to the lateness of the book. "I don't think we were consulted enough," says Scott.

According to Stewart, "We had little editorial guidance from Jerril." Nilson comments, "We had weekly staff meetings. Most of the staff was there the year before, and I just told them what I wanted and they passed it on to their staffers. I also had certain office times. Unfortunately, I was stuck doing administrative stuff like paying bills, ordering supplies and bookkeeping besides my regular responsibilities."

Comparing her yearbook to the previous yearbooks, Nilson comments that "my color and feature sections are the best so far. But I failed miserably in the housing,

sports and academics." Of these three, the housing was the hardest thing to do, according to Nilson.

"We decided to have individual photos because with the group shots, the dates for picture taking were changed a lot, people didn't show up, and then they were mad because they weren't in the book," she said. "The studio that took the individual shots didn't take down the information about each student clearly enough and so we had to go back and find out who was who and where they had lived. That alone slowed us down by about four to six months," she

says.

"Nobody put much emphasis on sports," Nilson says of the section. "It was hard to keep up with events, it was hard to get pictures. We got a little information and few pictures on the minor sports, which were the ones we wanted to cover most. Copy never got written and there was no way to go a year back to find who was who in the pictures so I had to make a decision to have it be a photo section."

Rick Taylor, current editor of the Oregana, expects a decrease in sales because of the '77 yearbook.

"People aren't going to buy the '77-'78 and '78-'79 yearbooks because when they see the 1977 book they'll say 'I don't want to buy a book like that.' The book is laid-out well, but it has no depth to it."

Nilson has gotten some negative feedback from the book.

"Some people want their money back. Others have written to Pres. (William) Boyd. We give no refunds unless people have ordered more than one book by mistake. That prepaid money has already been spent. When someone orders a yearbook, they have to trust the staff to make sure that they will receive it," she says.
