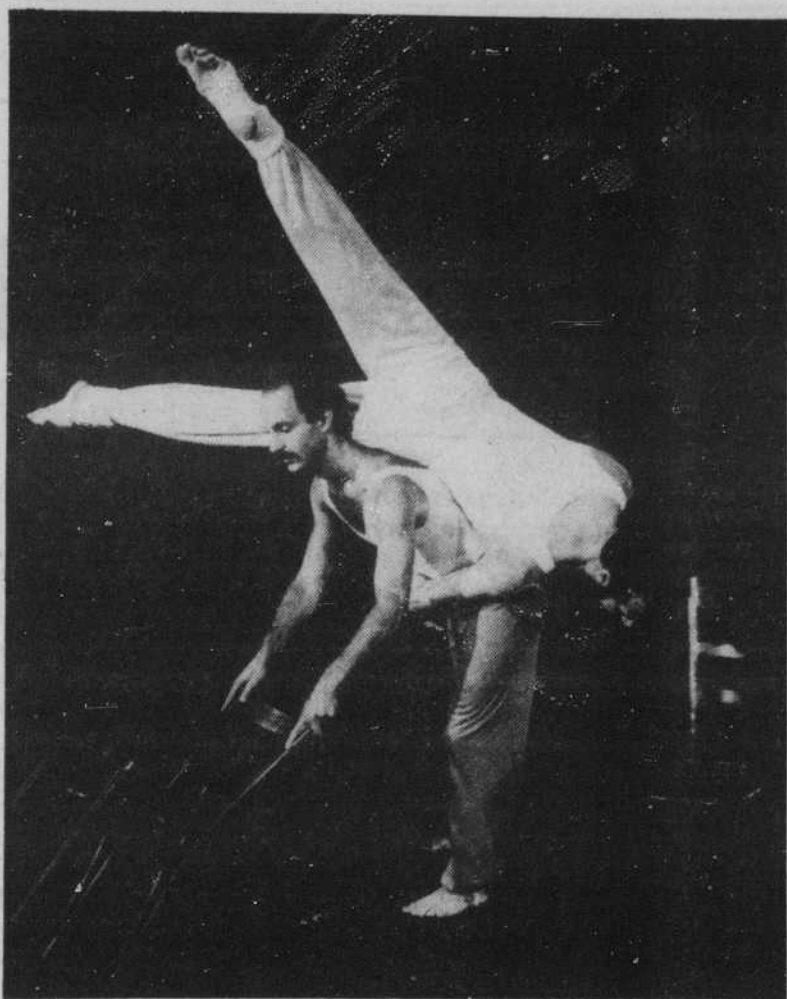




Seattle dancers stage act, offer two workshop series

Good improvisation often looks like choreography, just as good choreography often looks like improvisation.

It's on this premise that the American Contemporary Dance Company (ACDC) will base their performance and workshops at WOW Hall Oct. 31 and Nov. 1-2.

The Seattle-based touring trio performs under the artistic direction of Joan Skinner, former dancer with the Martha Graham and Merce Cunningham dance companies, and Robert Davidson.

ACDC was founded in 1972. Since then, the dancers have strived to develop a highly-refined communication among themselves and with their audiences. The three soloists will perform choreographed as well as improvisational pieces.

Two series of workshops will be offered. The Skinner Releasing Dance Technique will be taught Oct. 31 and Nov. 1-2 at 11 a.m.-1 p.m. Contact Improvisation is the subject of three workshops on the same days at 11 to 3 p.m. The fee for each workshop is \$15 for all three days of instruction. All workshops are at WOW Hall.

ACDC will stage a formal performance next Thursday, 8:30 p.m. at WOW Hall, 8th and Lincoln. Tickets are \$3.50 at the door.

Music school tries new wings, celebrates with concerts galore

This is a big weekend for campus music lovers. The University School of Music is celebrating the dedication of the Music Building's new north and east wings with a smorgasbord of concerts.

All dedication events are free of charge. The dedication is being held in conjunction with Homecoming Week.

The celebration begins Friday at 6:45 p.m., with the Chamber Choir in Beall Hall, the Cello Ensemble in the Orchestra Room, the Percussion Ensemble in the Percussion Room, and a number of organ students performing in the Organ Recital Room.

The University Consort performs in the Choral Room at 7:15 p.m. and the Orchestra Room becomes the site of a concert by the Woodwind Quintet. The evening will be capped by the Jazz Lab

Band in Beall Hall and the Earely Musick Players in the Choral Room, both performing at 7:45 p.m.

The formal dedication of the new additions will take place at 10:15 Saturday morning. Platform guests include Chancellor Roy Lieuallen; University Pres. William Boyd; Music Dean Morrette Rider; Betty Reves, State Board member; and George Long, University Music Society chair.

Special music has been written for the ceremony by three music school faculty members. "Dedication Fanfare," composed by Monte Tubb, will be performed by the Brass Ensemble with organ and directed by Ira Lee. "Oregon Fancy," written by Derek Healy, will be performed by the University Sinfonietta, under the direction of Lawrence Maves. "Music,

Nature's Voice," composed by Harold Owen, will be performed by the University Singers, directed by Paul Westlund.

Following the dedication, the Alumni Chorus, led by Jerold Ottley, conductor of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, and the Alumni Band will join the University Singers in a special half-time Homecoming show during the Oregon/Washington State game.

The weekend festivities will conclude Sunday at 2 p.m. with a special faculty concert in Beall Hall. The concert includes Francis Koscielnny, violin; Victor Stienhardt, piano; vocalist Exine Baily, and piano accompanist Marlene Thal; Johan Benson, fortepiano; and John Hamilton, organ. **By Raymond Voigt**
