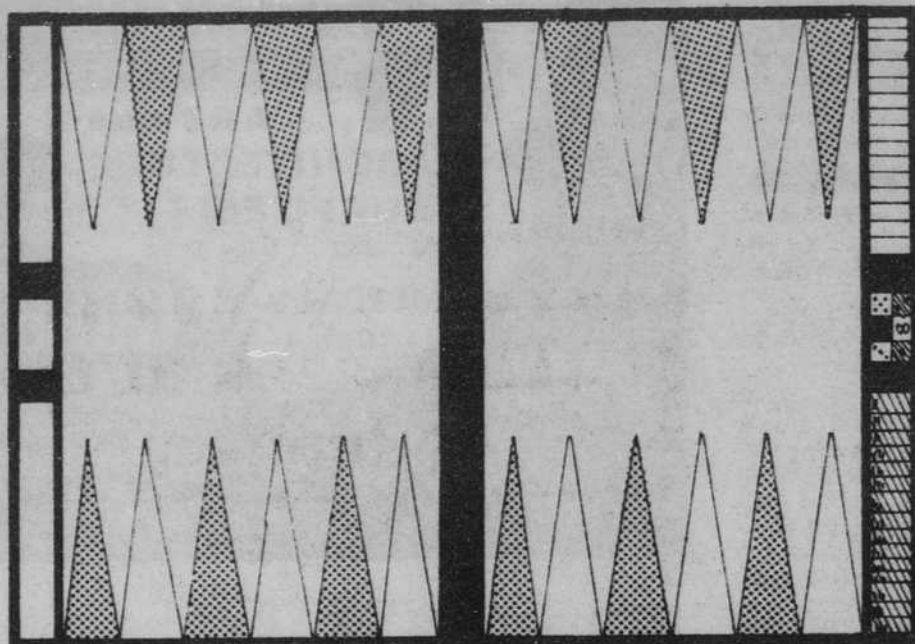

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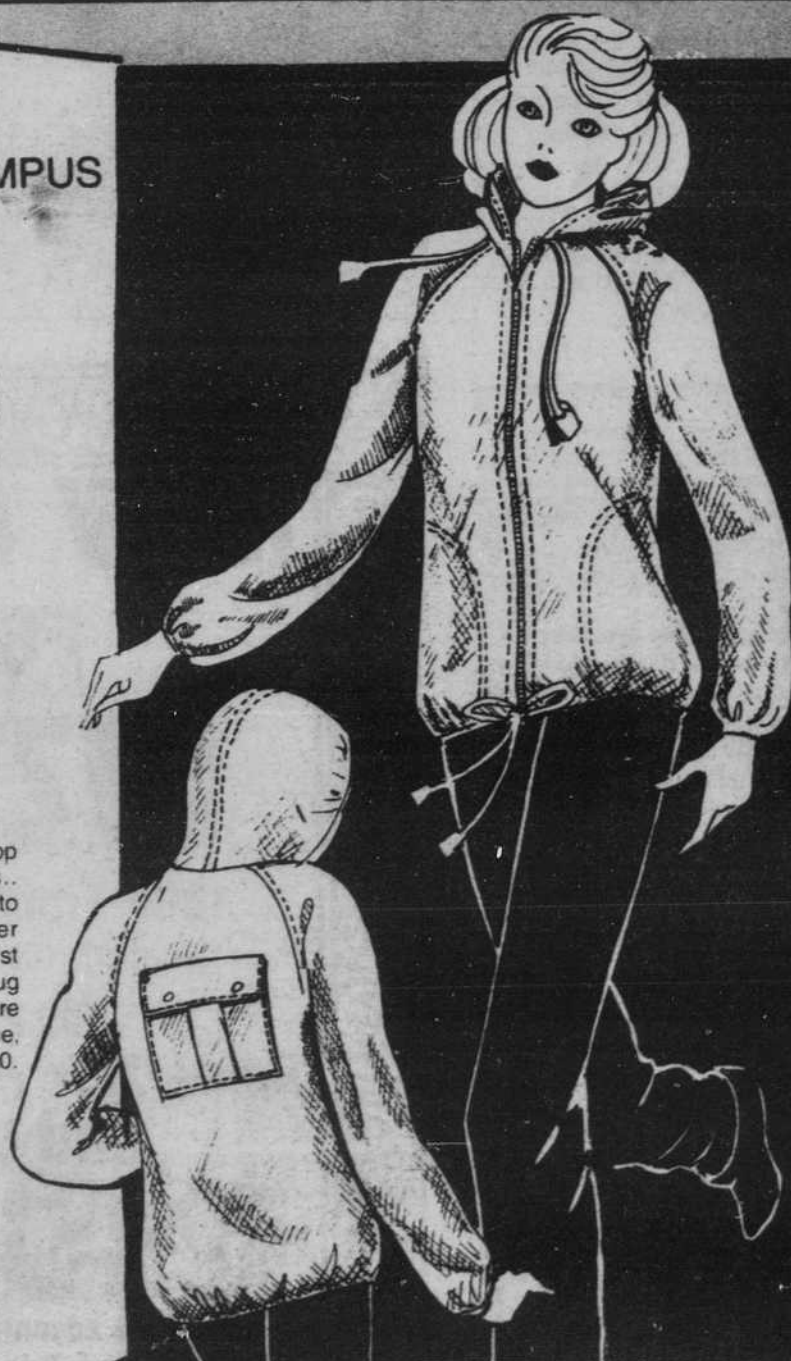

Spikers dominate OCE

The University volleyball team avenged an earlier loss by beating OCE last night, in three straight sets.

According to coach Chris Voelz, Oregon's netters dominated the offensive credits in rolling up the scores of 15-7, 15-13 and 15-9.

"We adjusted our defense around the block more," says Voelz. With the net play of Mary O'Brian and Annetta Ensworth,

the spikers had 25 offensive credits while OCE was held to nine. The Ducks also had four ace serves.

With a record of 11-16-2, the volleyball team now has two days of practice before the Oregon Invitational this weekend. This respite is welcomed by Voelz. "The season is not conducive to skill development, because there are not enough practices, and too many matches."

Hockey team records shutout

Closing out the Northwest season with a 13-0 record, the University field hockey team defeated OCE 3-0 yesterday.

Now 15-2-1 overall, Oregon had 28 shots on goal compared to none for the hosts. Lynn Manildi scored in the first half for Oregon, and Ronnie DellaMotta and Bindy Stillwell each added one goal in the second half.

"We had trouble getting up for the game, and it took time to adjust to playing on a bumpy field," says coach Nancy Plantz.

Once accustomed to the conditions, the Ducks had little trouble disposing of OCE for the second time this season. "I thought that OCE improved and took advantage of their home field," says Plantz.
