

Oregon Supreme Court holds hearings in Eugene

The Oregon Supreme Court will conduct five hearings Friday in Eugene at the request of the University Law School.

The hearings will be in Harris Hall in the Lane County Courthouse. It will be the third year the court has convened in Eugene, Eugene.

The state's highest appeals court was invited to sit in Eugene by the University Law School for the "primary reason of education," says Doug Haldane, assistant dean at the school.

"The court's visit gives our students a chance to see the Oregon Supreme Court at work," says

Haldane, adding that the hearings will also give law students a chance to see attorneys at work, using legal research in the courtroom.

Among arguments to be heard by the court Friday is the appeal of three Eugene high school principals on their reassignment to junior high school positions. Defendants in the case include school board members of Eugene School District 4J and outgoing Superintendent Tom Payzant.

The court is scheduled to hear two cases in the morning session beginning at 9:30 and three cases in the afternoon beginning at 1:30.
