John Merriman, assistant professor of history, will speak on the shift from corporate to class solidarity among workers in a rapidly changing industrial city of western France in an illustrated lecture entitled "An Incident at the Statue of the Virgin Mary: Social and Political Consequences of Rapid Urbanization in Nineteenth Century Limoges, France."

Merriman received his doctorate degree in history from the University of Michigan. He is the author of a new book, "The Agony of the Republic: Repression of the Left in Revolutionary France, 1848-1851."

NAVAL INTELLIGENCE OFFICERS
