

Students to vote in runoff election

Students will have one more chance this week to choose who will represent their interests on both the Incidental Fee Committee and the Student University Affairs Board.

Runoff elections will be held Wednesday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at polling places both on and off campus.

In the race for the IFC, 15 candidates are still in the running for seven positions. The ASUO Con-

stitution calls for 14 finalists, but a re-count of last week's primary ballots gave Clark Harris a tie for the final spot in the runoff.

Two other SUAB contests were decided Monday by the ASUO elections court. The court voted not to disqualify victorious SUAB candidates Mark O'Brien and Harry Benedict, and upheld their elections position 17 (undeclared) and 10 (architecture and allied arts) respectively.

Students killed in car accident near Estacada

University students Catherine Haas and Steven Chester, both residents of Bean Complex dorms, died last weekend in a car accident near Estacada.

Chester, a 24-year-old sophomore, was driving back from Bagby Hot Springs Saturday night when the car left the road and sank into the North Fork Reservoir off Oregon 224. Haas, a 20-year-old freshman, was a passenger in the front seat.

Two survivors, students Mark Chester and Anthony LaRocca, were hospitalized with minor injuries. Neither was sure why the car left the road. Both were riding in the back seat and said they were "half asleep" at the time of the accident.

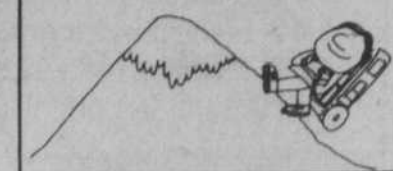
