

Community program helps convicts

Give a person a job, provide him with food, clothing, shelter and surround him with people with whom he has something in common. And then, one day, take that all away.

Adult offenders on parole need some feeling that they are wanted, says Caroline Lustbader of the Voluntary Action Center. They need someone to listen to them and to tell them how to go about looking for a job and a house—and picking up the pieces of a life.

Those are some of the difficulties former inmates face in Eugene Lustbader says.

"How can you feel wanted when there is no job or no housing for you in the community," she says.

Lustbader is the coordinator of a four-week-old Community Corrections Volunteer Program aimed at people on probation, parole or work release programs. CCVP, a state-funded program, is an extension of a parole or a probation officer's duties.

The program will focus on job development, support counseling, tutoring and job skills training.

Participation in the program will not be required of people who are on probation or parole and the program is now geared for the offenders who want the services.

So far, the program has been funded through June 1979 with the total budget of \$18,877 to cover Lustbader's salary, a half-time clerk and reimbursement money for volunteers who have to travel.

"I have a high interest in community cor-

rections," Lustbader says. Under the University's "Year for action" program two years ago, Lustbader coordinated an inmate referral program for the Lane County Adult Corrections Facility. She interviewed and evaluated inmates' needs and referred them to appropriate programs.

"I like to get in on the ground level and do what I can to make it (corrections) work," Lustbader says.

The groundwork for the program has just been completed and Lustbader is now in the process of recruiting volunteers.

Once established, the program will employ about 30 volunteers with a system for feedback from the staff, volunteers and clients on such things as the performance of the volunteers.

Training sessions will be held at least four times a year and will focus on the local criminal justice system, the responsibilities of parole and probation officers, community resources, work release center operations and basic communication skills.

A system for volunteer recruitment will double as a public education program to inform the public as to what kinds of problems adult offenders face and what volunteers can do to help them.

The volunteer is a valuable asset to the program, Lustbader says.
