

To promote study *Students examine leisure interests*

Students in Leisure Studies, a group of park and recreation majors, is now forming to promote the personal and professional interests of leisure services students.

"We need to organize and find out more about our profession than just what we learn in the classroom," says Theresa Duncan, a park and recreation major who is among those students leading the drive to bring leisure services students together.

Duncan says the main goals of the organization will be to send student representatives to faculty curriculum meetings, form ties between students at the University and

professional organizations from around the state, and bring leisure services students together socially.

"Within the next two weeks we'll start our membership drive," says Becky Piske, also a park and recreation major interested in developing the group. She hopes that the organization will function both as an action group on behalf of leisure studies students and a social club as well.

A few students became interested in organizing a group last spring at the suggestion of some faculty members, says Duncan.

Formal organization of Students in Leisure studies was put off by students concerned about the possible effects of Ballot Measure 6. Students worked to defeat the measure because they feared it would eliminate job opportunities in the park and recreation management field.

"We've been working so frantically on the election we haven't had time to push the club," says Piske.

Duncan says those students already interested in the group want to "make more people within the park and recreation management field aware of our ideas, and if there is enough interest, we'll go ahead."

Duncan would like to see members from Students in Leisure Studies representing student's interests in curriculum meetings such as the college's Undergraduate Curriculum Committee. As more students become involved, she hopes that Students in Leisure Studies will work with other committees and staffs where curriculum and program decisions are made, she says.

While the major emphasis in organizing Students in Leisure Studies is educational, the social aspects of the group are important also, says Duncan. "We're all 'rec' students," she says. "It only seems natural we should get together and --recreate."
