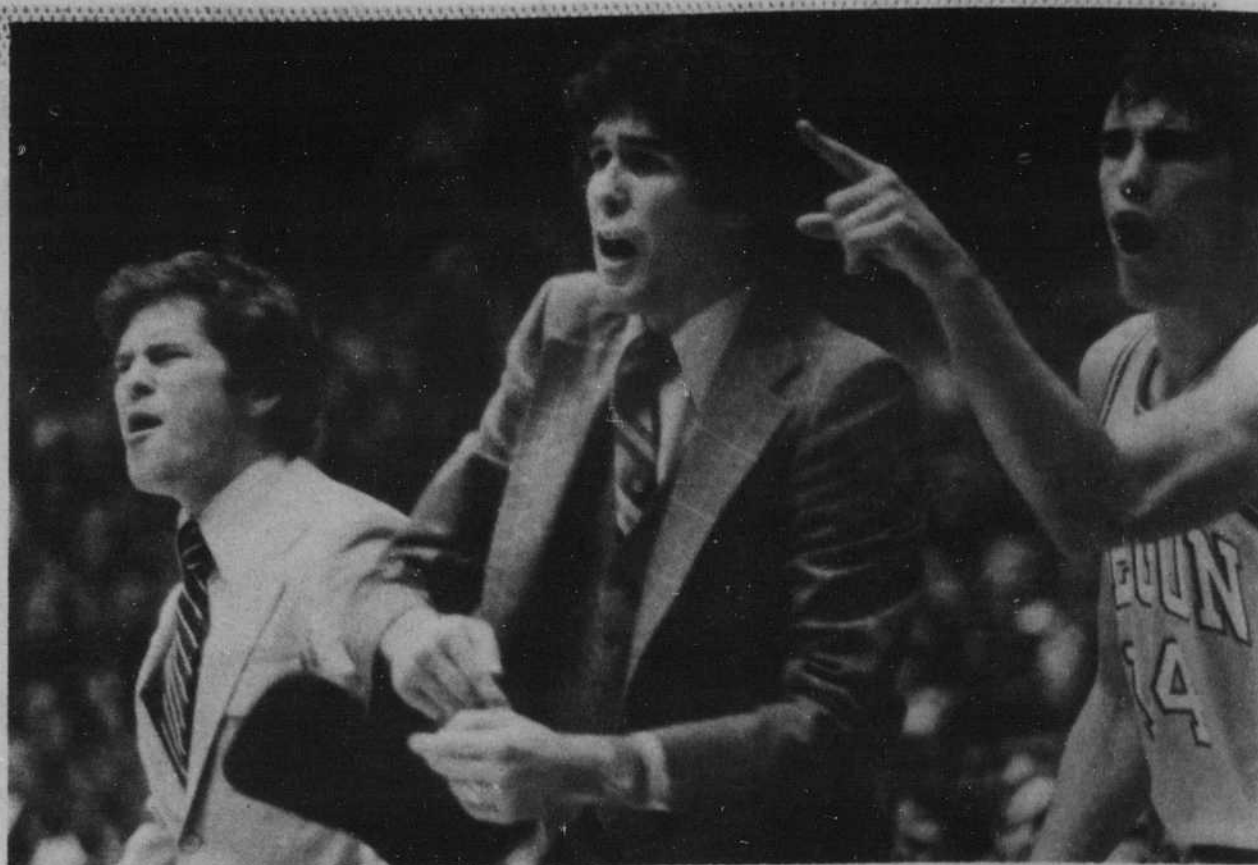

Turnovers plague Ducks; Sac State tonight's foe

Tonight the men's basketball team faces Sacramento State, a squad with a 6-5 center and a 0-2 record.

Only one starter returns from last year's team, which lost to Oregon 90-67. Playing in the Far West Conference, Sacramento State cannot give scholarships, thus relying on walk-ons and junior college transfers.

Interim coach Elmo Slider looks to returning guard Ted Borum for leadership. Six foot tall point guard Steve Nunes and 6-3 forward Don Opdyke are the only other players that played on last year's 13-14 squad.

Center Rickey Patterson and 6-4 forward Pete Dosh round out Sacramento State's starting lineup. "We're a very young team and a very small team," says Slider.

In its first two games, his team's play was inconsistent. "We played pretty well against Fresno, but we didn't play nearly as well against Bakersfield," he says.

Sacramento State played Fresno evenly, but was overwhelmed by Bakersfield according to Slider. "Their kids were quicker and bigger, and we lost by 17 points," he says.

With size and quickness problems, can Slider hope for a victory over the Ducks? "Well, we are still an unknown quantity, so all we can do is experiment, and try to get ready," he offers.

Slider is unsure of game tactics. "We run a passing offense, and a pressure man-to-man defense, but against bigger teams we may run a zone," he says.

Normally a running team on offense, Slider says he may try to slow the tempo, since the Ducks also run. "We may have to do some of the countering - we may have to slow it down."

Oregon coach Jim Haney doesn't know too much about the opposition and he doesn't seem to care. "We need to concentrate on improving the things we're doing," he says.

Haney isn't sure what will happen tonight, but wants to play against Sacramento State's zone defense. "I'd like to see us have to play against a zone. The sooner we see one the better."

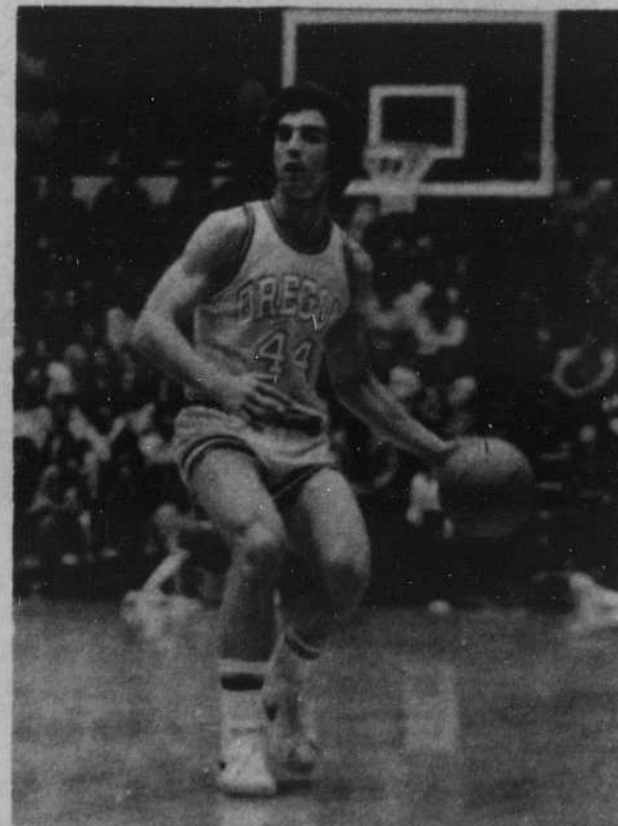
The coach is also concerned with the team's defense. "We had to play defense over longer stretches of time," he says of Friday's game against

San Diego State.

The Ducks did seem to block out on the defensive boards, says Haney, but they didn't rebound well. "I was pleased with the way they blocked out, but they didn't follow through and grab the ball cleanly," he says. "San Diego State got too many second and third shots."

The offense also had trouble holding on to the ball, says Haney. "There were a lot of forced turnovers - 28 is enough for two games."

Haney says he thinks tonight's game will help provide the experience needed to overcome the Ducks' biggest foe - inconsistency. "We need to improve in a number of areas," he says.

Duke stays atop poll, UCLA second

Duke's Blue Devils, a convincing 25-point winner over Western Kentucky, remained atop the Associated Press' college basketball poll after the first major weekend of action.

The Blue Devils, rated No. 1 in the pre-season poll, garnered 42 of 51 first-place votes and 1,010 points Monday in voting by a

nationwide committee of sports writers and broadcasters, and held a wide margin over runner-up UCLA.

The Bruins, who posted victories over Boise State and DePaul last weekend, received six first-place votes and 925 points to remain second.

Notre Dame, which did not play last weekend, received one

first-place vote and 829 points to hold third place, while Kansas, also idle last week, moved from fifth to fourth with one first-place vote and 726 points.

Louisville, a 72-66 loser to North Carolina State Sunday night in the championship game of the Sea Wolf Classic at Anchorage, Alaska, dropped from fourth to fifth place in the poll with 704 points.
