Humans a part of nature, not masters, author says

Perhaps the essential error in modern civilization's attitude toward wilderness is its tendency to consider humans the masters of nature when in fact they are only a part of it.

For the more than 100 persons who gathered Wednesday evening at Eugene's Laurelwood Golf Course clubhouse to hear him, author Barry Lopez' message was basically one of humanity.

Lopez' appearance was sponsored by the Many Rivers Group of the Sierra Club.

Works by the Finn Rock, Oregon author have appeared in Harpers, Readers Digest, Mariah and Esquire Magazines. His books include Desert Notes and Giving Birth to Thunder, Sleeping With His Daughter: Coyote Builds North America.

Lopez' most recent published work, "Of Wolves and Men," has earned him the greatest notoriety. Recently he appeared on the Dick Cavett Show to discuss the book.

Among other things, "Of Wolves and Men" describes the ways humans want to control wolves, Lopez said. We invest them with "good" or "correct" qualities, forgetting they have their own natural state, their own reason-for-being.

Scientists suffer from the same delusion. "It's dangerous for science to say it's not anthropomorphic, that it gives us an unadulterated, objective point of view," he said. And often the most articulate voices for wilderness are those who aren't scientists.

Lopez' most artistic expression of his notion of humility came as he read a short passage he had written for the 1980 Sierra Club calendar. "You and I and the trout and the tree are all relatives." We are animals' brothers, not their fathers, he added later.

Lopez discussed dogs to illustrate human arrogance toward all animals. Dogs represent 30,000 years of in-bred behavior. We throw a stick across the floor, and a puppy walks to it, picks it up and brings it back to us.

We like dogs because they respond to us with what we call love and loyalty. However, in the end result that's what we've designed them to do.

Humans are confounded when wolves don't react like dogs. We throw a stick to a wolf and are puzzled to see it gaze back at us

indifferently. Of course, many humans believe wolves are "wild" dogs when in fact they are an entirely different species.

Lopez incorporated humility into his thoughts on writing.

He said he once tried to express this idea to a dancer. "It's as though each person is given a dance at life's beginning. Your life is to do your dance. If you're fortunate, you'll learn your few steps early in life."

If you're very fortunate, others will see your steps, learn them and carry them on.
