The cost is \$2.50 and \$1 for children under 12. Money from the event will go to the Women's International League of Peace and to fight herbicide use.

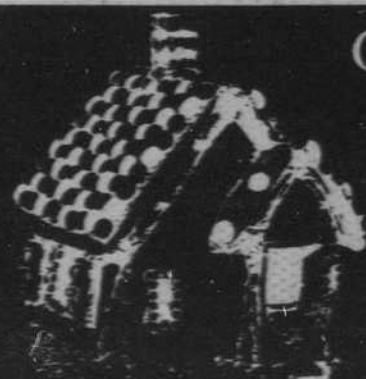

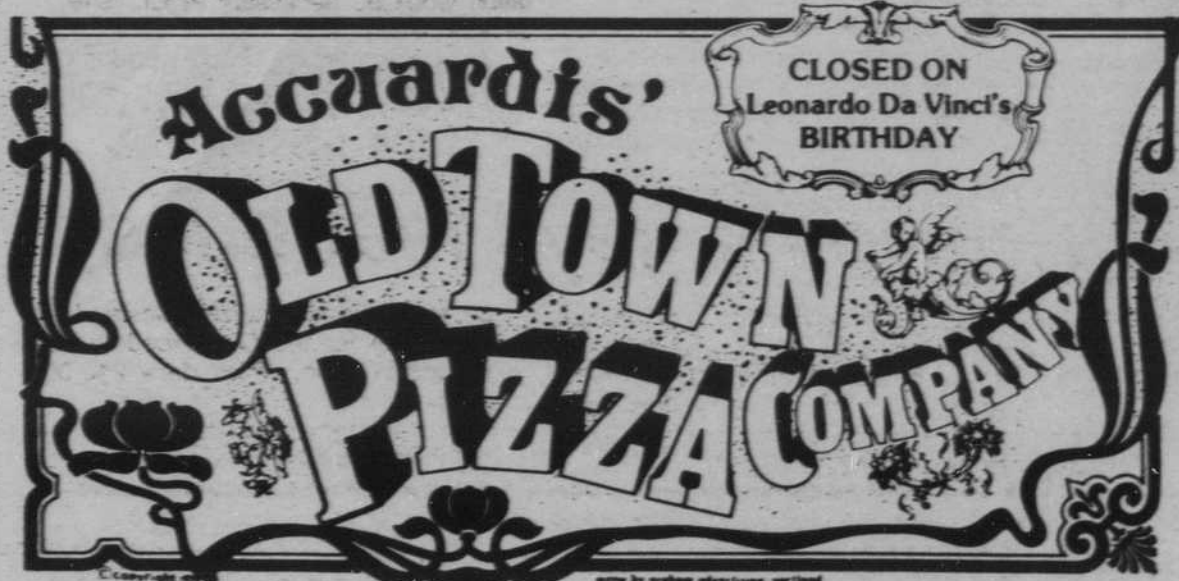
