## Feds probe adult education projects

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government is taking a look at adult education programs around the country and what needs to be done to improve them.

Usually when agencies make such an investigation they propose rule changes and then solicit comments on them from the public.

Instead, the Office of Education has decided to seek your thoughts first. That way, officials said, the whole weight of bureaucratic inertia isn't already behind some proposals when new suggestions are made.

The agency will accept written comments until Jan. 2.

While all types of comments will be considered, the agency has some specific areas in which it wants your thoughts. These include ways to expand adult education beyond the public schools, programs to find the persons most in need of education, flexible schedules, transportation and child care services.
