DENVER — Oil companies and a union of 60,000 refinery workers remained at an impasse Sunday night in a contract dispute focusing on President Carter's wage guidelines. A nationwide strike was feared when the workers' contracts expired at midnight.

"All offers from the oil companies have been rejected by the union," said Jerry Archuleta spokesman for the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers International Union, which was monitoring local bargaining from Denver. "We can report no progress at all."

PASADENA, Calif. — Voyager 1, homing in on Jupiter, is sending back "fantastic" pictures that make the huge planet look "like a big Easter egg," a spokesperson said Sunday.

The craft's cameras clicked on Saturday, 37 million miles from the Jovian surface and the first transmissions were received Saturday afternoon, said Frank Bristow of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, where the pictures are being received.

"Some information is being returned, but it takes time to study it," Bristow said. "But the pictures are just fantastic. Jupiter is a beautiful planet."

PEKING — China said Sunday that Vietnam invaded Cambodia "to serve the Soviet Union in its expansionist plan," and called on the United Nations to intervene in the border war, a government statement said.

Former Cambodian head of state Prince Norodom Sihanouk met with Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping and "exposed the towering crimes of Vietnam in invading Cambodia and expressed the Cambodian peoples' determination to resist aggression," the official Chinese news agency Hsinhua said. It said Teng reaffirmed China's support for Cambodia.

PORTLAND — About 30 persons marched around the Multnomah County Courthouse Saturday in support of an Oregon Law that makes rape a crime even if the persons involved are married.

"We're upset about the petition circulating in the state to repeal the rape-in-marriage law," said Cathy Scheiman, one of the organizers of the march.

"We want the public to be aware that they are trying to take this law away from us."

Oregon's so-called marital rape law, which allows a married woman to file rape charges against her husband, received national publicity recently. John Rideout, of Salem, was tried and acquitted in Marion County Circuit Court on charges he raped his wife, Greta.

NEW YORK — An elderly woman goes on trial Monday on charges stemming from an alleged plot to kill a judge and kidnap her millionaire ex-husband.

Maria Petra Ramsay, 71, is charged with conspiring to murder Surrogate Court Judge John Skahane, who granted a divorce in 1975 to her husband, Joseph Gales Ramsay, and cut off her \$65,000-a-year alimony.

Protestors resume anti-shah riots

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Hundreds of protesters set fires and smashed windows in Tehran on Sunday, renewing demands for Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi's abdication and ending four days of relative calm in the capital.

Anti-shah rioting also was reported in at least six other cities and four persons reportedly were killed.

In the capital, heavily armed military police dispersed protesters with tear gas and gunfire, and one person was killed, officials said. The official Pars news agency said a policeman was killed in the western city of Hamadan and that two protesters died dur-

ing a demonstration in Baneh, in western Iran.

The official Iranian state radio said thousands paraded in Qom and bank windows were smashed in Tahriz. Opposition sources reported demonstrations in Tahriz.

Thousands thronged to a Tehran hospital where movies and photographs of previous demonstrations were shown.

The four days of comparative calm that prevailed while Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar formed a new government halted after Paris-based Ayatollah Khomeini, the shah's chief religious opponent, denounced the new government as "illegal" and called for it to be overthrown.

Many shops in Tehran were shuttered and black flags of mourning hung outside. Opposition groups declared Sunday a day of national mourning in memory of victims of past riots in which an estimated 1,500 persons have died. A similar observance was set for Monday.
