Ducks take gymnastics meet

Oregon's men gymnasts set a school record for meet points during their 220.60-206.25 win over visiting Cal-State Fullerton Thursday night, prompting Duck coach Bill Ballester to say after the meet, "we are probably the best team in the country tonight."

While the win most likely will push Oregon up near the top of the national ratings, the Duck performance also acts as a confidence builder.

"We have a long way to go. But I have to be encouraged by it. And I think it is the highest score in the nation this year," Ballester said.

Spearheading the Ducks was Gene Christensen's first place finish in the all-around with a total of 54.25. He was followed by teammates Kelly Crumley and Miki Moyal.

But Ballester insisted the judges' scoring was also beneficial to his team.

"When they (gymnasts) feel they are getting the scores they deserve, they begin loosening up. And when we compete loosely, we perform well," says Ballester, who also praised the performance of Gordon Hocking, a first place finisher in the horse.

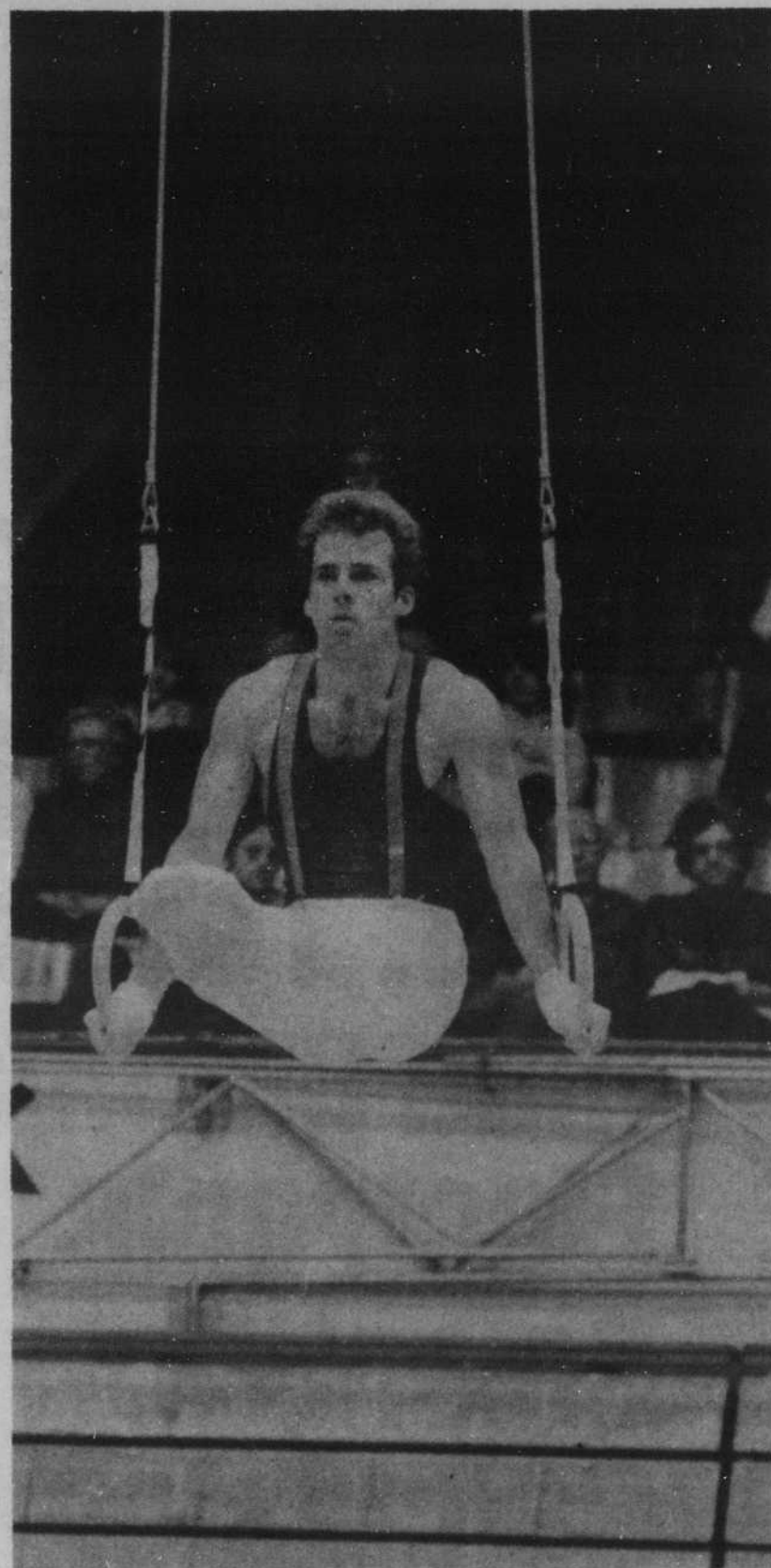
"I think I am going to give him the super Duck award for the meet," says Ballester. In addition, Randy Beard won the high bar with a 9.70 score.

"It was a little shakey, but I made it again," explains Beard, "I still have a couple of new tricks to put in (his routine)."

Jim Kelch headed an Oregon sweep of the parallel bars with a 9.45 performance, while the Ducks Mark Knupp won the floor exercise.

Cal-State Fullerton did have a few bright spots. Ron Howard soared to a 9.80 score in the vault, well ahead of Oregon's Marty Vassey and Miki Moyal. Cal-State's Donnie Evans, a second place finisher in the floor exercise, took fourth in the all-around.

Oregon's next meet will be away, against Brigham Young next Thursday.
