## Lukacs receives grant

Anthropology Prof. John Lukacs has received a grant from the Indo-American Fellowship program for six months of research on the Paleocology of Prehistoric Man in India beginning in April.

Lukacs was also offered a Fulbright to teach in India but turned it down in order to devote all his time to research, he says. Lukacs will concentrate on the changes in disease patterns as prehistoric humanity's economy and diet changed from hunting and gathering to more sedentary agricultural societies.

Lukacs says he will visit collections of prehistoric skeletal remains in Calcutta, Bombay and New Delhi museums.
