 Persons interested in membership in the organization may contact the group's secretary. Everyone is invited to attend. There is no charge, but people are asked to bring food for the potluck.

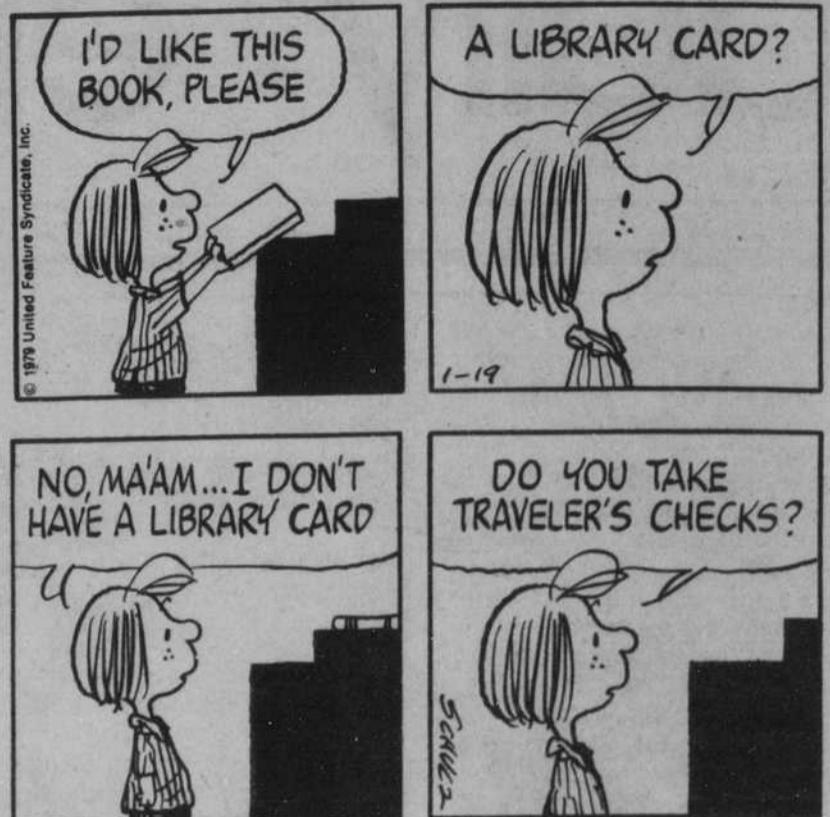
Hosts needed for boarders
