Oregon pinned for loss

Despite an outstanding performance by Don Brown at 177 pounds, Oregon's wrestling squad lost another one-sided match to an outstanding Oregon State team Monday night in McArthur Court.

The Beavers outwrestled the Ducks, 26-9, on the weight of four superior decisions, but Oregon coach Ron Finley felt his team gave a good account of itself.

Brown turned in the best performance for the Ducks Monday, beating nationally ranked Marty Ryan 7-2. Ryan owned a 19-2 record going into the match, but Brown wasn't surprised at all about the result.

Despite the match's outcome, Finley was pleased with the team's effort. "Jim Hildebrand did a heck of a job out there," Finley said of the 142 pound freshman's performance. Hildebrand led NCAA de-

fending champion Dan Hicks 4-3 going into the third period. Hicks came back to win the match, 20-10.

Senior Les Simon also gave the 1,500 Duck fans something to cheer about, giving Oregon State's Mark Evenhus a tough battle before losing 11-10. Simon, who had not wrestled for three weeks, led Evenhus 6-1 entering the final period, but fatigue gave way to two near falls in that third period.

Adam Cuestes provided the Ducks' first points, decisioning Randy Majors, 10-8, in the 118-pound match, while 190-pounder Ryan Kelly defeated Gary Yarco, 9-8.

Top-ranked Ducks halt Arizona State

Men's gymnastics coach Bill Ballester hasn't changed his opinion about Arizona State.

Even after a 217.85-216.35 win over the Sun Devils in Tempe on Saturday, Ballester still insists ASU will be Oregon's top challenger when the Western Regional Qualifier rolls around on March 23.

"Nothing has changed at all," explains Ballester. "I still think they are the team to beat. I don't think they have reached their peak. They are going up to the level they belong at."

"If they had not blown the high bar (last event), they would have beaten us," says Ballester. "They still competed more up to their potential Saturday night than they had anywhere through their season."

The win over ASU was only one of three away meets for Oregon last week. The Ducks stopped

Brigham Young 214.70-172.0 Saturday and the following night defeated Arizona 218.2-209.95.

"I think we have a good shot at an undefeated season right now,"

says Ballester. "Arizona State took that away from us last year. And I am sure we will be ranked number one (in the nation) this week."
