

On hazardous material transport

County commissioners sponsor workshop

The Lane County Commissioners voted Tuesday to sponsor a public workshop on transportation of hazardous materials through the county.

A date will be set for the workshop this week.

The commissioners' action expanded a proposed workshop that was to deal with the transportation of only radioactive materials. The workshop, approved by the old three-member board last Dec. 20, was designed to provide background information for a proposed ordinance regulating movement of radioactive material.

A majority of the present five-member board, however, asked to reconsider the workshop. At Tuesday's meeting, the three

new commissioners — Otto t'Hooft, Harold Rutherford and Vance Freeman — raised questions about both the workshop and the Ordinance.

"I don't think we should be singling out one hazardous material when there are many more materials that are just as hazardous," said t'Hooft. He claimed the county was taking a "piecemeal approach."

Rutherford said there were other, more threatening substances than radioactive materials being transported through Lane County. "We're only touching the tip of the iceberg," he said, adding that the state ought to "set perimeters" of radioactive materials regulation.

Freeman and Commissioner Archie Weinstein agreed that both state and federal governments should be involved in designing an ordinance.

"I think with any action here, we're going to have to work with the federal government and the state," Weinstein said.

Commissioner Jerry Rust, who offered the use of his staff in setting up the workshop on radioactive materials, made the motion to add to the workshop a session on other hazardous materials.

The motion passed unanimously.

"I'm in favor of getting a handle on the full range of hazardous, toxic material," said Rust, who was "happy" with the commissioners' decision to include hazardous materials in the workshop. "It's clear that the main thrust of the workshop will be on radioactive material," he added.

Doug Barber, director of Clergy and Laity Concerned, the organization which sponsored the original ordinance, said he is

concerned that an attempt to include regulation of other hazardous materials in the radioactive materials ordinance would water down its effect.

Such an ordinance would not fulfill the original intention of the radioactive materials ordinance he said.

Barber said he is not optimistic about the original ordinance's chances for passage. "It certainly doesn't sound good. Of the three new commissioners, I don't think I heard any of them say they are in favor of the ordinance," he commented.

"I guess we'll do the workshop and see; my hunch is that we will probably have to go to some sort of county-wide initiative to get a radioactive materials ordinance."

The next reading of the ordinance is scheduled for March 7.

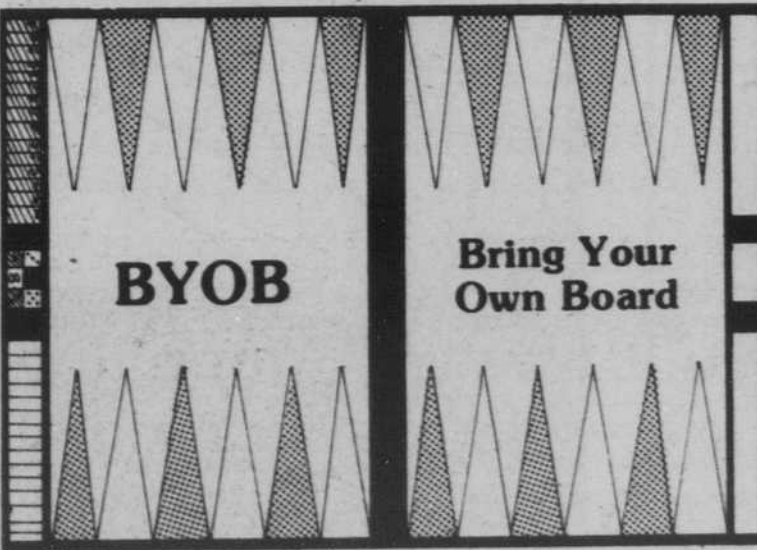
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
