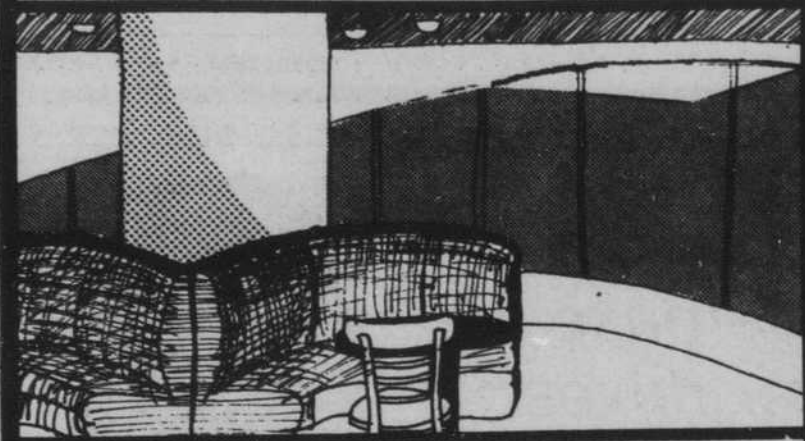

Museum design discussed

Architectural engineer Derek Pike, a former staff member of the firm which helped develop the structural design of the controversial "Centre Pompidou" art museum in Paris, will speak at the University Wednesday.

Pike, now a project engineer for John Herrick, a Eugene structural engineering firm, will discuss the structural design of the Centre Pompidou at 7:30 p.m. in Room 177, Lawrence Hall.

Pike moved to Eugene last year from a job with ARUP Associates of London, an internationally known architectural firm which employs specialists from several disciplines.

Among other projects, Pike helped re-develop the Naval Dockyards at Portsmouth, England and worked on the structural design of a multi-use housing development in Manama City, a city in the Persian Gulf country of Bahrain.

The slide-illustrated lecture, sponsored by the University architecture department, will be open to the public free of charge.
