Editor-publisher to talk on chain newspapers

A California newsman's lecture
on the trend toward group owner-
ship of U.S. newspapers will high-
light the 60th annual Oregon
Press Conference, to be held at
the University Friday.

The conference is sponsored
jointly by the Oregon Newspaper
Publishers Association and the
School of Journalism.

Delivering the Eric Allen
Memorial Lecture at a noon lun-
cheon Friday will be Howard (Tim)
Hays, Jr., editor and co-publisher
of the Riverside (Calif.) Press and
Enterprise.

Hays' lecture will be titled "The
Future of Group Newspaper
Ownership: Many Questions and
a Modest Proposal."

A veteran newspaperman who
is also a lawyer, Hays is a director
of the American Press Institute, a
member of the Pulitzer Prize Ad-
visory Board and a former presi-
dent of the American Society of
Newspaper Editors.

Friday night a talk on "Com-

munications: Lights and
Shadows" by University rhetoric
and communications professor

Dominic LaRusso will cap the trad-
itional press conference banquet,
to be held at 6:30 p.m. in the Wil-
lamette Room of the Valley River
Inn.

LaRusso has served as a com-
munications consultant to
businesses and educational or-
ganizations throughout the world,
including Xerox Corp., Boeing
Corp., Fiat, Georgia-Pacific Corp.
and Sundstrand Corp.

Other seminars, panel discus-
sions and talks scheduled Friday
include sessions on newspaper
advertising, journalistic interview-
ing and legislation before the
Oregon Legislature which might
affect newspapers.

Registration for the conference
will start at 8:30 a.m. Friday in 221
Allen Hall and all sessions, except
the evening banquet, will be held
on the campus.
