Foreign study available

Foreign study programs in Japan, France and Germany offer opportunities to students who apply immediately in Oregon Hall.

There is no language requirement for the Japanese program. Classes are taught in English at the International Division of Waseda University in Tokyo. Students take Japanese language classes and live with Japanese families.

Students who will have completed two years of French by September are encouraged to apply for the program in Poitiers. All classes will be taught in French and students will live with families, in dorms or in boarding houses.

The program in Germany offers students the opportunity to study at one of six universities in and around Stuttgart. Two years of college level German is required because students are completely integrated into the German university system. All students will live in the residence halls with German students.

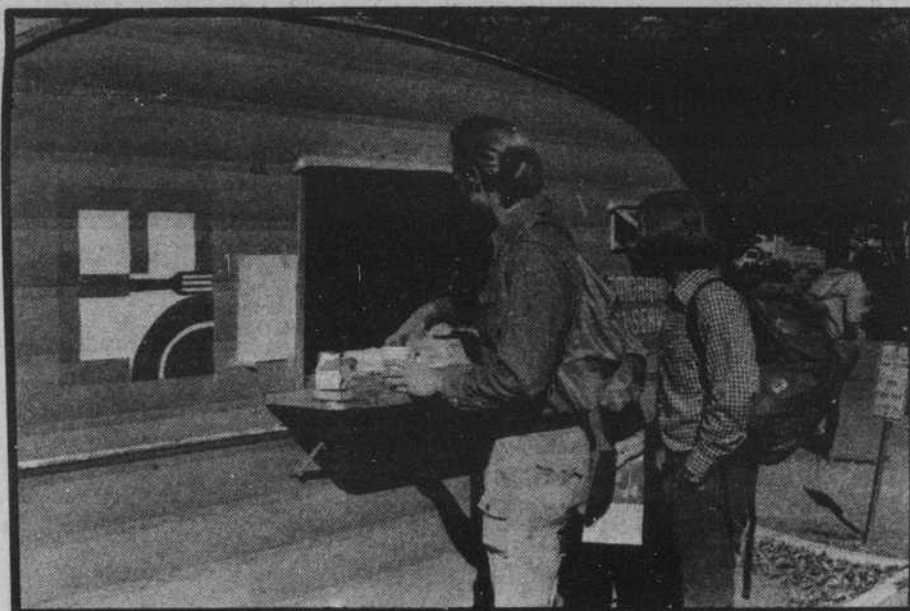
