"Stress Management" will be held Wednesday. The six-class series costs \$25.

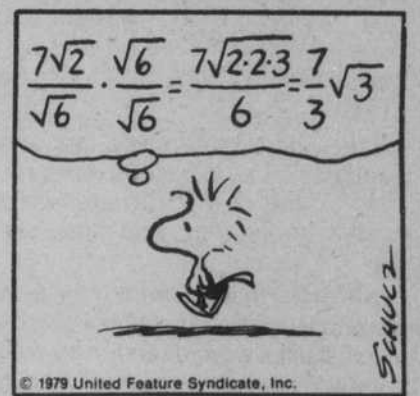
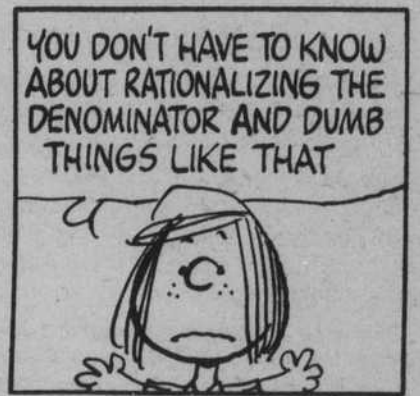
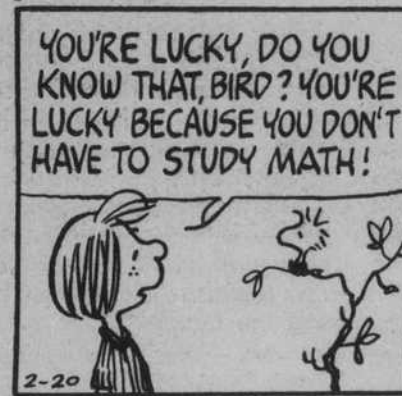
"A Healing Journey Through Visualization" will be held Wednesday afternoons. The six-class series costs \$25 per person or \$45 per couple.
