

Actor to read Jewish lit

Joseph Wiseman, an internationally renowned actor, will read excerpts from Jewish literature today at 8 p.m. at the Central Presbyterian Church.

The lecture is the third in a four-part series on "Faith and the Human Condition" sponsored by the University Campus Christian Ministry, the Jewish Student Union and Temple Beth Israel.

Wiseman, who lives in New York City, was a member of the original Lincoln Center Repertory Company and has appeared in numerous motion pictures including "Viva Zapata," "The Valachi Papers" and "The Apprenticeship of Duddy Kravits."

Tickets are available at the Campus Christian Ministry, the JSU and Temple Beth Israel. Admission is \$2 for senior citizens and students and \$3 for all others.

War activist speaks

David Truong, defendant in the "Vietnamese espionage case" brought by the justice department will speak in Eugene at 12:30 and 7:30 p.m. in Rm. 121 A, University Law School.

Truong will speak about his case and the time he spent in Federal Prison and about the serious implications the case holds for civil liberties in this country. Truong was fairly well known in anti-war circles of the '60's and '70's.

Social philosophy to be discussed

Luce to speak about Iran

Don Luce, international director for Clergy and Laity Concerned, will speak about his recent trip to Iran today at 12:30 p.m.

His lecture is titled "Eyewitness: Revolution in Iran" and will be held at the Wesley Center, 1236 Kincaid St.

Luce returned from Iran Jan. 22 with former Attorney General Ramsey Clark and Richard Falk, an international law expert. They were in Iran at the time of the shah's departure and observed mass demonstrations in Tehran.

The three met with a cross-section of Iranians as well as prominent religious and political leaders, including Prime Minister Mehdi Bazargan and Foreign Minister Karim Sanjabi. On their way home, they met with the Ayatollah Khomeini in Paris.

Luce first visited Iran in January of last year at the request of Iranians in this country.
