

County won't shave L-COG audit cost

Despite objections from one member, the Lane Council of Governments voted Thursday night to begin the process of selecting an organization to evaluate the agency's programs. The L-COG general board approved a resolution by the county commissioners to pay the total cost of the evaluation, although several members originally objected to that idea. The agency's executive board decided last week to pay for the audit from the L-COG budget.

CALC official to detail facts from Iran trip

Don Luce, International Director for Clergy and Laity Concerned, will speak in Eugene Friday, reporting on his third fact-finding tour of Iran. Luce's talk is titled "Eyewitness: Revolution in Iran" and will be delivered at 12:30 p.m. in the Wesley Center, 1236 Kincaid St.

The EMU Cultural Forum is co-sponsoring his speech with CALC.

Luce returned from Iran on Jan. 22 with former U.S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark and international law expert, Prof. Richard Falk. They were in Iran at the time of the shah's departure.

The audit was first proposed by former Commissioner Bob Wood during his last regular meeting in December. Wood criticized the agency for what he considered a duplication of services already provided by other county programs.

During its regular meeting in January, the L-COG board agreed to the audit and asked that the county pay half of the costs while

sharing in the responsibility for the audit's content.

The commissioners decided last week they would study the audit objectively, but leave the costs to L-COG. The evaluation costs \$10,000 and will involve an audit of all programs provided by the agency.

L-COG Executive Director Tom Jenkinson told the agency that once the audit is completed, the

results could be used to combat criticism or change the agency. That idea was echoed Thursday night by other L-COG members.

Although the general board decided to begin the search for an audit firm, Larry Perry, the agency's representative from Lane Community College, said the audit might not be serving its intended purpose.

Perry objected to the audit be-

cause the commissioners were not going to participate in the process. The audit was originally approved to ease the commissioners' fears about program duplication, he said, so it should not be done without their participation.

"The way it stands now, the county has to agree that the evaluation shows the COG worthwhile, or they'll pull out," Perry told L-COG members.

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
