Film tour grant awarded

John R. Shepherd, a University professor of speech who teaches a film studies course on the National Film Board of Canada (NFB), has received a \$2,500 grant from the Embassy of Canada in Washington, D.C., to visit the five regional NFB headquarters this summer.

The grant was awarded under the provisions of the Canadian Studies Faculty Enrichment Programme. Shepherd was chosen from a national pool of U.S. university professors.

Shepherd says he will make the visit between mid-August and late September. The trip will allow him to gather material for his NFB course, he says, and to gather new material for an additional course on the regionalization of the NFB.
